CALL TO ORDER

Board chair Greg Chilton called the regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:35 PM, Tuesday, October 25, 2016 at the Foundation's Monterey office.

Greg Chilton presented Steve Dart with his award of appreciation for 6 years of service on the CFMC board. Steve was unable to attend the Celebration of Philanthropy where other departing board members received theirs.

CONSENT AGENDA – Greg Chilton

Greg Chilton asked the board if they had any questions or required clarification on matters related to the consent agenda. There were no questions or concerns.

Motion: to approve the Consent Agenda. Catherine Kobrinsky Evans / Birt Johnson, Jr. second. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR – Greg Chilton

Greg Chilton reported the Celebration of Philanthropy held October 20, 2016 at Corral de Tierra Country Club was a successful, positive event. There were positive comments about Bill Tyler's, inspiring acceptance speech as the recipient of the Distinguished Trustee Award. Greg thanked the CFMC board and staff and asked for comments about the program, logistics, venue, food, etc. An alternative venue to Corral de Tierra was discussed for 2017, depending on the geographic location of the next recipient.

The recommended dates for the 2017 Board Retreat are Saturday, January 21 or January 28, 9:00AM to 1:30PM. There was discussion for educational topics such as: Community Foundation Fundamentals 101, How CRT's and other investment vehicles work, How Grants Are Reviewed and Received. The board will choose a date and confirm the agenda topics at the December meeting.

Greg reported on the Non-Profit Alliance of Monterey County, Core Community Leader Award presented to Dan Baldwin. The Core Community Leader Award is presented to an individual who has made a significant positive difference in the nonprofit community. Dan was recognized for his instrumental support of hundreds of nonprofit organizations and projects throughout Monterey County. Most recently he has led the charge to raise funds to aid those in our community affected by devastating forest fires.

Greg reminded the board of the importance of 100% board giving. Many third-party funders require 100% board giving for the CFMC to qualify for their grants.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Ken Petersen

Ken Petersen reviewed the Pooled Endowment Portfolio Overview. He summarized the fourth quarter investment landscape, asset allocation and preliminary portfolio returns.

Next Investment Committee meeting is November 14.

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE - Steve McGowan

Steve reviewed the September Development Summary, highlighting the year to date contributions, overall expectancies and activities report.

Steve discussed a handout, titled, *Pre-and Post-Conversion to Non-Endowed Funds*, noting the dramatic increase in grant making dollars available in 2016 compared to 2012-2014.

CFMC's Philanthropic Services Department is offering a two-part Donor Education series, "Good vs Good," November 16 and 30, 2016. CFMC board member Betsy Buchalter Adler will lead a conversation on how to choose among the many potential destinations for your gifts of time and money.

Christine Dawson reported the Southern Monterey County Foundation will hold a grants ceremony November 15 in King City. All board are invited to attend.

TREASURERS REPORT- Gail Delorey

Gail Delorey reviewed the August 31, 2016 and September 30, 2016 financial statements.

Gail reviewed the budget, actual and variance line items and discussed the budget process and outlook for the 2016 year-end results.

Motion: to approve the August 31, 2016 Financial Statements. Gail Delorey /Birt Johnson, Jr. second. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion: to approve the September 30, 2016 Financial Statements. Gail Delorey /John Phillips second. Motion carried unanimously.

Gail requested approval of a Merrill Lynch Corporate Resolution required for the Martin Dodd bequest.

Motion: to approve the Merrill Lynch Corporate Resolution stating Dan Baldwin is, "authorized and empowered to convert, endorse, sell, assign, set over and deliver any and all shares of stock, bonds, notes or other securities standing in the name of or owned by this organization and to make, execute and deliver any and all written instruments of assignment and transfer necessary or proper to effectuate the authority hereby conferred."

Tina Starkey Lopez/ Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

Tina Starkey Lopez reported on the status of the request for proposals (RFP) sent to six CPA/Audit firms. Four firms responded. Interviews will be held on November 29. The Audit Committee will recommend a firm for approval at the December board meeting.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE – Rick Kennifer

Rick reported the committee has three candidates that have confirmed their interest and availability for the CFMC board. There are two other candidates that will approached to fill the fourth new board positon. Rick asked the board that any concerns or comments be stated either at the meeting or to contact Dan or Rick privately. The new board slate of candidates will be voted on at the December meeting.

GRANTS AND PROGRAMS COMMITTEE – Patti Hiramoto

Grant Recommendations and Approvals

Patti reviewed the grant recommendations since the last board report.

- A. August 1, 2016 September 30, 2016. The Community Foundation awarded 217 grants totaling \$2,169,275. This includes:
 - a. Grants previously approved by the Board
 - b. Grants previously approved by the Executive Committee
 - c. Restricted fund distribution (all grants approved December 15, 2015, with approval of the spending policy)
- B. Robert and Virginia Stanton Endowment grant recommendations (10 grants totaling \$164,000)

Motion: To approve the 217 grant awards from August 1 – September 30, 2015 totaling \$2,169,275 and the Robert and Virginia Stanton Endowment grant recommendations (10 grants totaling \$164,000).

John Phillips / Birt Johnson, Jr. second. Motion carried unanimously.

Laurel Lee-Alexander presented two grants for approval not on the agenda.

- a) John H. Marble Fund grant to the Monterey Museum of Art (\$197,367.00). This is the first payment of their annual payout; the second payment will be paid in March 2017.
- b) The DeWitt Fund grant for \$500,000 to the Big Sur Land Trust Carmel River Free Stewardship Fund

Motion: to approve the John H. Marble Fund grant to the Monterey Museum of Art for \$197,367.00 and the DeWitt Fund grant for \$500,000 to the Big Sur Land Trust Carmel River Free Stewardship Fund.

Catherine Kobrinsky Evans/Birt Johnson, Jr. second. Motion carried unanimously.

Community Impact Funding Limit

Patti reviewed the history behind the recommendation to eliminate the five-year consecutive funding limit for Community Impact (CI) grantees, that was presented at the August 23, 2016 Board meeting. In response to requests for more data, Laurel Lee-Alexander presented the information that was requested:

- 1. Ineligible grantees for 2017
- 2. Grant applications that were not approved due to: a) weak requests, or b) funding limitations (by year)
- 3. Since 2012, new applicants (by year)

After a lively discussion by the Board with comments, opinions and questions regarding the pros and cons to change to the Community Impact Guidelines, a decision was reached to work with the Grants

and Programs Committee and bring the topic to the January 2017 Board Retreat. In the meantime, a one-year extension to the current guidelines was recommended.

Motion: to add a one year extension to the five-year consecutive funding limit guideline for Community Impact Grants through 2017 the grant cycle.

Bill Sharpe / Rick Kennifer second. Motion carried unanimously.

Soberanes Fire Fund Report

Laurel showed a PowerPoint highlighting the impact of the relationships built and money distributed into the community to date from the Soberanes Fire Fund (Total Gifts: \$905,439.20; Total Grants \$294,063). There is a plan for a report to the community in the future.

Dan Baldwin apprised the board of new funds since August meeting.

PRESIDENTS REPORT – Dan Baldwin

Salinas Office: Parking and Security

Dan reported on the enhanced security systems installed at the Salinas office. There are parking permits being distributed to staff, but the parking lot is more limited on space with the building fully leased. The schedule for 2017 Board meetings in Salinas will be discussed with new board chair.

Palm Terrace

Dan reported on the sale of the Palm Terrace property in Hawaii.. The CFMC has been removed from the chain of liability.

King Foundation Update

Dan reported CFMC attorney, Chris Campbell, appeared September 14, 2016 in the Monterey County Superior Court regarding the Dan and Lillian King Foundation. The petition she presented asked the court to clarify Lillian King's intent, and the court confirmed CFMC has legal standing as the successor owner of the assets held by the Dan and Lillian King Foundation, upon the death or resignation of their initial chair.

The court also asked the King Foundation to provide a full accounting to the court 10 days prior to the next hearing, November 30. The King Foundation must also show that their internal documents and 990 filing are up to date and accurate.

Elliott Trust

Dan reviewed a new fund that will come from the dissolution of the Howard and Elva M. Elliott Trust and create a non-endowed designated fund at CFMC. The fund will support Ventana Wilderness Society and Big Sur Land Trust for 20 years. At the end of 20 years, the assets transfer to The Nature Conservancy.

Sue Antle CRAT

The Sue Antle Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust (CRAT), will be established with an appraised note and receive a 6.6% payout. CFMC will act as the trustee and Kaspick & Company, LLC will be the administrator.

CALL TO ORDER – Greg Chilton

Greg Chilton called the regular meeting of the Executive Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:30 PM, Tuesday, November 22, 2016 at the Foundation's Salinas office.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion: to approve the September 27, 2016 minutes: Gail Delorey/Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR – Greg Chilton

Greg Chilton reminded the committee about the board and spouse Holiday Social, December 13, at 5:45, after the board meeting.

The preferred date for the 2017 Board Retreat is Saturday, January 28, 9:00AM to 1:30PM. The alternative date is Saturday, January 21. The board will confirm the date at the December meeting and discuss agenda items. The only suggestions to date are to review Community Foundation 101 fundamentals and discuss the 5 year limit on Community Impact grants.

Greg reported that he attended the Southern Monterey County Foundation grant awards dinner in King City. He complimented the professionalism of the Philanthropic Services staff on how they led the meeting.

The 2017 draft calendar of board and committee meetings was discussed. The location of board meetings will be confirmed at the December board meeting.

TREASURERS REPORT- Gail Delorey

Gail Delorey reviewed the October 31, 2016 financials summary. After discussion, a motion was made to approve the financials as written.

Motion: to approve the October 31, 2016 financials. Gail Delorey / Steve McGowan second. Motion carried unanimously.

The Finance Committee met on November 22 to finalize and balance the 2017 budget. Gail summarized the budget notes and assumptions and asked for questions and comments. The 2017 budget will be presented for approval at the December 13 board meeting.

Motion: to recommend the 2017 budget as presented by the Finance Committee at the December 13 board meeting. Gail Delorey/ Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

Gail reported that RFP's for the 2016 audit were sent to six CPA firms. There will be interviews November 29, 2016 with the four firms that responded: Hayashi and Wayland, RGP, Ryan McDonald and Youngblood & Hodges will meet with the Audit Committee (Greg Chilton, Tina Starkey Lopez and Ken Petersen), Dan Baldwin and Diane Nonella.

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE – Steve McGowan

Steve McGowan highlighted the October Development Summary.

Christine Dawson reported on the 2-part donor education series presented by board member Betsy Buchalter Adler, titled "Good vs. Good." The second presentation is November 30.

Christine attended the 2016 Philanthropy Day luncheon Bill Tyler was the CFMC honoree.

Christine noted there are new opportunities to promote 2016 IRA rollovers which was made permanent.

Monterey County Gives is well underway.

The next Resource Development committee meeting is December 14.

GRANTS AND PROGRAMS COMMITTEE – Patti Hiramoto

Patti Hiramoto reported there are grant recommendations for approval by the Executive Committee.

- 1. Friends of Laguna Seca Capital Fund: (\$50,345.77) Agency Fund request
- 2. Pacific Grove Public Library Foundation Stewardship Fund: Pacific Grove Public Library Foundation (\$582,816.29) Stewardship Fund request
- 3. Soberanes Fire Fund: Coast Property Owners Association (CPOA) \$97,353 for road repair and replacement of culverts to prepare for winter rains.
- 4. Five Special Purpose Fund grants totaling \$365,000:
 - Terry Layne Fund: Point Lobos Foundation \$20,000 for Sea Lion Point and Sand Hill Trail Restoration (trail materials)
 - Douglas Madsen Fund for HIV/AIDS Housing: Access Support Network -\$47,000 for Maximizing Housing Stability & Preventing Homelessness for People Living with HIV in Monterey County; Natividad Medical Foundation - \$3,000 for Emergency shelter for HIV/AIDS patients with housing instability or homelessness
 - Springer Fibromyalgia: Montage Health \$78,000 for Financial relief for 30 patients (over two years) with Fibromyalgia or Chronic Fatigue Syndrome; Salinas Valley Memorial Hospital Foundation \$98,000 for Un-reimbursed medical expenses for 37 Chronic Fatigue, Fibromyalgia and Gulf War Syndrome patients

- Anita Tarr Turk for Breast Cancer: Damon Runyon Cancer Research Foundation
 \$100,000 over two years for Breast cancer research (UCSF)
- Tri-County Blood Bank: Salinas Valley Memorial Hospital Foundation \$754 for Reimbursement for blood and blood products; Mee Memorial Hospital - \$2,352 for Reimbursement for blood and blood products; Natividad Medical Foundation -\$15,894 for Reimbursement for blood and blood products

Motion: to approve all the grants as described and recommended by the Grants and Programs committee. Ken Wright /Steve McGowan second. Motion carried unanimously.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Ken Petersen

Ken Petersen reported the committee discussed the 2017 payout rate for endowed funds and 10-year outlook for the rate of return on investments. The Investment Committee recommends continuing with the 4.5% payout rate.

Motion: to recommend for approval to the board a 4.5% payout rate on endowed funds.

Ken Petersen / Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

Ken reported the Robert Haas CRT was reviewed and the committee approved allocating some of the assets to a more aggressive portfolio.

The Investment Committee reviewed the requirements of Verus, and discussed Verus' performance. At the end of the discussion the committee approved maintaining the relationship with Verus for another year.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE – Rick Kennifer on the phone

Rick Kennifer reported the Governance Committee contacted the four candidates nominated to the 2017 board. The four have all agreed to serve on the board. The new board members will be presented for approval at the December 13 board meeting.

Raul Rodriguez, Patti Hiramoto and Ida Lopez Chan will be contacted for a second term.

Ken Wright / Gail Delorey second. Motion carried unanimously.

Jimmy Panetta will resign at the end of 2016 and the Governance Committee will meet in early 2017 to review possible candidates.

PRESIDENTS/CEO REPORT - Dan Baldwin

Dan reported on the final meeting of League of California Community Foundations where he has presided as Chair of the Board since 2015.

The Monterey County Gives campaign started November 10 and has reached \$1,100,400 as of November 22. 2016 has produced more individual donors to date, due to the nonprofit agencies becoming more experienced in how to maximize the MC Gives campaign for year- end giving.

Dan updated the committee about the Forbath and Vega promissory notes. The Thomas Forbath note on the First National Bank Building, 101 South Cotton Street, Andalusia Alabama is in escrow.

The Nelson Vega note has a final payment due in 2016. Both notes look like a final payout will occur soon.

Dan described the Elizabeth Schaefer CRT that is in the preliminary stages of approval. There is real estate involved that is currently undergoing a Phase 1 environmental inspections before the CFMC will accept the terms of the trust. Dan recommended the Schaefer CRT move forward once the Phase 1 environmental report is returned and acceptable.

Motion: to approve the acceptance of the Elizabeth Schaefer Charitable Annuity Trust if the property included in the trust has a clean Phase – 1 Environmental Report. Ken Wright / Gail Delorey second. Motion carried unanimously.

The King Foundation

Dan reported the next hearing for the Dan and Lillian King Foundation is November 30. The court has ruled the CFMC is the successor trustee of the foundation when the current chair of the board is no longer serving. The King Foundation will be submitting internal documents and 990 filing for review at the November 30 hearing. There will be another update to the full board at the December 13 meeting.

The meeting of the Finance Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County was called to order by Gail Delorey at 2:05PM on October 25, 2016.

Minutes

On a motion by Ken Wright, seconded by Greg Chilton, the minutes of the August 23, 2016 meeting were accepted as written.

Financial Statement Review

Gail Delorey reviewed the complete financial statement for August 2016.

On a motion by Ken Wright, seconded by Greg Chilton, the committee approved the August 2016 financial statement.

Gail then reviewed the complete financial statement for September 2016.

On a motion by Greg Chilton, seconded by Ken Wright, the committee approved the September 2016 financial statement.

Discussion Items

Dan Baldwin reviewed the budget status and timeline. Dan described the process and methodology used in the budget preparation.

Dan next reviewed the Growth-At-a-Glance charts, and pointed out we are on track to have a record year for grantmaking.

Spending Policy recommendation for Board Action Item

Ken Petersen informed the committee that he and Dan Baldwin recommend we retain a 4.5% payout rate for 2017.

Anne then reviewed the new ESG and Medium-Term portfolios.

Investment Policy Statement (IPS) Annual Review

Anne Westreich reviewed the presentation for investment objectives, procedures, performance, practices and fees, as described in the IPS.

The committee discussed the historical total return goal of 8%, and agreed the new investment objective will be a total return goal equal to, or exceeding, the policy index.

Action Item

Ken Petersen reviewed the details of the Robert Haas CRT; 10% payout, invested in an income pool (16% equities/84%fixed), the expected 20+ year time horizon, and the recommendation from

Paul Williamson at Kaspick, which is to move the funds to an Income/Growth allocation (39% equities / 61% fixed income) for a period, and then consider an additional step to Growth/Income.

The committee discussed the recommendation, and at the conclusion on a motion by Bill Doolittle, seconded by Bill Sharpe, the voting members of the committee approved the assets in the Robert Haas CRT be moved to an Income/Growth allocation portfolio.

Investment Consultant Review & Recommendation

Anne Westreich was excused.

Ken Petersen stated we are happy with Anne and Verus' performance, as demonstrated by recently signing a new three-year engagement agreement.

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<u>Assets</u>

Total Assets through 10/31/2016 are \$194,251,245 a 7.09% increase since October 2015, and a 6.91% increase since December 2015.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$146,924 less than the budget, and total expenses were \$112,160 less than the budget. The actual net operating deficit is \$298,679 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$263,914.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 4.8 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000.

Gifts, Pledges, Bequests, Future Funds Greater than \$25,000, and Grants

Total new contributions for the month were \$1,292,627, including \$600,000 from Legal Services for Seniors to establish the Legal Services for Seniors Stewardship Fund; \$75,200 from Ventana Wilderness Alliance for the Ventana Trails Forever Fund; \$50,000 from Taylor Fresh Foods for the Monterey County Gives Campaign, \$30,000 from the Roman Catholic Bishop of Monterey for the Monterey County Gives Campaign; \$50,000 from the Friends of Carmel Valley Library for the Friends of Carmel Valley Library Stewardship Fund; \$100,000 from the David and Lucile Packard Foundation for Soberanes Fire Fund. Gifts to the Soberanes Fire Fund totaled \$240,762, including gifts from Donor Advised funds in the amount of \$1,000. The year-to-date gifts to the Soberanes Fire Fund totaled \$922,816, including gifts from Donor Advised funds in the amount of \$64,600, and \$10,000 from the CFMC Opportunity Fund.

Grants to agencies for the month totaling \$320,764 were approved and recorded.

Interfund activity for the month totaled \$519,000.

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Assets

Total Assets through 11/30/2016 are \$195,385,085 a 7.49% increase since November 2015, and a 7.54% increase since December 2015.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$102,901 less than the budget, and total expenses were \$114,128 less than the budget. The actual net operating deficit is \$457,308 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$468,535.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 4.0 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000.

Gifts, Pledges, Bequests, Future Funds Greater than \$25,000, and Grants

Total new contributions for the month were \$1,521,028, including \$50,000 from the Colleagues of the Arts to establish the Colleagues of the Arts Endowment Fund; \$30,000 from Dottie Massie for the Monterey County Gives Campaign; stock valued at \$49,695 from George Somero and Amy Anderson for the Amy Anderson and George Somero Fund; \$200,000 from the Landreth Family Foundation for the Landreth Family Fund; stock valued at \$98,069 from Marc Rosen to establish the Marc Rosen CRT, stock valued at \$50,190 from Sarah Patterson Spencer for the Monterey County Gives Campaign; \$100,000 from the Tanimura Family Foundation for the Girls' Health in Girls' Hands Scholarship Fund; \$66,700 from Robert V. Sanford III for the Monterey County Gives Campaign; and stock valued at \$64,647 from Fred Terman and Nan Borreson for The Fred Terman and Nan Borreson Fund. Gifts to the Soberanes Fire Fund totaled \$13,992. The year-to-date gifts to the Soberanes Fire Fund totaled \$936,808, including gifts from Donor Advised funds in the amount of \$64,600, and \$10,000 from the CFMC Opportunity Fund. Total gifts to the Monterey Count Gives campaign totaled \$966,660, including gifts from Donor Advised funds in the amount of \$141,750. The year-to-date gifts to the Monterey County Gives Campaign totaled \$1,241,062, including gifts from Donor Advised funds in the amount of \$141,750.

Grants to agencies for the month totaling \$840,238 were approved and recorded.

Interfund activity for the month totaled \$197,274.

2016 YEAR END

Current year-end projection includes net income of \$1,809.

Year-end projections include:

Contribution revenue is under budget, primarily due to the contribution budgeted from College Futures Foundation, which will not be received. The budget included an additional year of planning funding; however, the quality of the planning process advanced the program to the implementation phase.

Administrative fee revenue is under budget. Due to the drop in the stock market, the portfolio recorded an unrealized loss of more than \$4.8 million in the months of November and December 2015, resulting in the 1st quarter admin fees being calculated on fund balances that were much lower than expected.

Special Projects fee is above budget due to the implementation of the College Futures Foundation program; and the Community Leadership Project grants management fees, which were not budgeted.

Personnel costs are lower than budgeted due to the vacant accounting clerk position.

Administrative costs are under budget due to the following:

- Computer Maintenance reduced expense for additional work
- Contract Services CNE program evaluation being funded by the David & Lucile Packard Foundation; and the elimination of video production
- Conferences & Trainings reduced number of conferences attended
- Misc. Admin Expense WF lunch proceeds transfer less than expected
- Depreciation Expense reduced due to the timing of capital purchases

Occupancy costs are over budget due to the addition of earthquake insurance.

Program and Development costs are under budget due the reduction in the number of workshops, the reduction of presenter fees, and more workshop expenses paid by third party funders; radio ads expense being less than budgeted; and fewer meetings than budgeted.

OPERATING CASH RESERVE

The unrestricted cash available as of November 30, 2016, is \$917,640, representing a reserve of 4.0 months.

2017 BUDGET

2017 includes revenues of \$2,767,008, and expenses of \$2,749,701, for a net surplus of \$17,307.
