CALL TO ORDER - Steve McGowan

Steve McGowan called the regular meeting of the Executive Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:30 PM, Tuesday, March 28, 2017 at the Foundation's Salinas office.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion: to approve the November 22, 2016 minutes: Ken Wright / Greg Chilton second. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR - Steve McGowan

Steve McGowan asked for observations on the Community Foundation Fundamentals course that Bill Sharpe, Ken Petersen, Betsy Buchalter Adler and Birt Johnson, Jr. attended in March. Phil Carey attended from the CFMC staff. The board members felt it was well worth their time, useful to learn from peers and provided new information on the community foundation field.

Christine Dawson described the Women's Fund Luncheon scheduled for May 9. Tracy Gary is the keynote speaker and author of *Inspired Philanthropy*. Tracy will hold a workshop at the CFMC on May 10 for donor advisors and prospects. Christine encouraged the board and guests to attend the luncheon.

Dan Baldwin provided a reminder on certain meeting protocols. There is some flexibility based on the current chair's style, but there are common rules and best practices for how the full board can operate in a meeting.

- The chair recognizes the member
- The member makes the motion
- Another member seconds the motion
- The chair states the motion: It is moved and seconded that...
 - Members can discuss the motion.
 - The chair asks for a vote

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Ken Petersen

Ken Petersen reported the Investment Committee will meet May 8. Ken handed out summaries for the Long Term, Medium Term and ESG portfolios.

The goals for the Investment Committee in 2017 are:

- Work as good fiduciaries following an established work plan
- Conduct quarterly performance review in accordance with the Investment Policy Statement
- · Review socially responsible investing options
- Review the asset allocation
- Review the Investment Policy Statement and asset manager performance
- Educate the board on specific investment strategies
- Designate the 2018 spend rate

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE - Betsy Buchalter Adler

Betsy Buchalter Adler reported the first Resource Development meeting for 2017 will be April 20. Betsy discussed the need to add two more members to the Resource Development Committee and recommended people with wealth management experience, attorneys and professional advisors. Christine Dawson commented that attorney Hansen Reed has been asked and accepted an offer to join the committee. Ken Petersen volunteered to join the committee.

The Executive Committee discussed the importance of committee chairs reporting back to the Governance Committee when committee members with specific skill sets are needed. They keep a list of potential candidates and interested community members.

Three goals for Resource Development 2017 include:

- Development of the Latino Philanthropy Initiative
- Growing family philanthropy
- Educating the community about philanthropy

TREASURER'S REPORT- Teri Belli

Teri Belli requested a change in the procedure for the presentation of financial statements in the Executive Committee meetings. The statements will be included in the committee packets, but since they have not been reviewed by the Finance Committee they will not be approved by the Executive Committee. If there are important issues in the statements they will be addressed, but otherwise the financial statements will be approved at the full board meetings after review by the Finance Committee. The Executive Committee agreed with the procedural change.

Teri requested two more members for the Finance Committee and recommended bankers or other finance oriented members. Dan and the Governance Committee will seek people to expand the Finance Committee's strength.

The goals for the Finance Committee 2017 include:

- Educating the board on the financial reports
- Looking at streamlining the internal financial report process
- Review the building reserve and what is the proper amount to hold
- Recruit more finance committee members

GRANTS AND PROGRAMS COMMITTEE - Patti Hiramoto

Patti Hiramoto reported on the goals for the Grants and Programs Committee.

1. The committee will look at the continuing growth of the CFMC and assess if the grantmaking and community impact are in alignment. They will determine whether existing programs are the right size and if the amount of work equals the value of the program.

2. Define the Community Impact Funding Limit Patti reviewed the history behind the recommendation to eliminate the five-year consecutive funding limit for Community Impact (CI) grantees, that was presented at the August 23, 2016 Board meeting. The committee will bring a recommendation to the May Executive Committee meeting and ask for a vote at the August board meeting.

Patti reported there is a grant recommendation for approval by the Executive Committee. The grant is:

• Fund: The Buffett Fund

• Agency: Oregon Shakespeare Festival

• Amount: \$100,000

• Purpose: the production of Othello to be performed in 2018

Motion: to approve the \$100,000 grant from the Buffett Fund for the 2018 Oregon Shakespeare Festival performance of Othello. Patti Hiramoto / Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE - Greg Chilton

Greg Chilton reported the CFMC board will have four board members stepping down at the end of 2017. The committee will start the nominating process by mid-year to select candidates to start in 2018. There are seven seats available.

In the meantime, two new board member nominees, Nolan Kennedy and Fred Meurer, have accepted joining the board and the board will vote by email to elect them. If elected they will attend the April 25, 2017 board meeting.

NEW FUND APPROVALS - Dan Baldwin

Dan Baldwin described the new funds approved since the last meeting.

PRESIDENTS/CEO REPORT - Dan Baldwin

Dan Baldwin announced that Josh Warburg has accepted the position of Program and Scholarships Officer. For the time being, he will continue to perform his duties in Philanthropic Services and work with Janet Shing in support of the CI grant cycle. The Philanthropic Services Department will advertise a position for a Philanthropic Services Associate. There is an internal workgroup doing an assessment of the workflow and conducting a series of interviews with staff based on the growth of CFMC in 2016/2017.

The King Foundation

Dan reported the next hearing for the Dan and Lillian King Foundation is May 17. The King Foundation attorney has told CFMC counsel that he agrees with our position. However, this has not been conveyed to his clients. There is an April 6 deadline for the King Foundation to

act on their appeal of the September 14, 2016 ruling for a final report on the King Foundation accounting. They have indicated they will let the deadline pass.

Joel Gambord/ CSUMB

Dan described the sequence of events that lead current CFMC donor advisor, Joel Gambord, to ask the CFMC to act as the steward of his bequest to CSUMB after his death. The bequest includes a large fund dedicated to nursing scholarships.

Executive Session

Steve McGowan asked for a short executive session.

COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FOR MONTEREY COUNTY NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the Four Months Ended April 30, 2017

<u>Assets</u>

Total Assets through 4/30/2017 are \$214,672,084 an 19.80% increase since April 2016, and a 2.56% increase since December 2016.

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2016.

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized losses were \$86, and unrealized gains were \$8,589,979, for a total gain of \$8,589,893.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$21,105 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$60,865 less than the budget. The actual net operating deficit is \$188,356 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$270,326.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 4.5 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000.

Portfolio Performance

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 4/30/2017 was \$171,474,557. The year-to-date Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio through April 30, 2017 was 5.6% compared to the Policy Index of 5.1%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 4/30/2017 was \$2,957,191. The year-to-date Total Return for the Medium-Term Fund Portfolio through April 30, 2017 was 4.0% compared to the Policy Index of 3.9%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 4/30/2017 was \$914,235. The year-to-date Total Return for the ESG Fund Portfolio through April 30, 2017 was 5.6% compared to the Policy Index of 5.5%.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Community Leadership Project, funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; Pathways to Safety, funded by the ACTION Council of Monterey County; Girl's Health in Girl's Hands, funded by the Claire Giannini Fund, the Peggy and Jack Baskin Foundation, the David and Lucile Packard Foundation and the Monterey Peninsula Foundation; College Futures, funded by the College Futures Foundation Fund; and the Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; and the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation.

Total Special Program revenue was \$147,959 and total expenses were \$232,516.

Gifts, Pledges, Bequests, Future Funds Greater than \$25,000, and Grants

Total new contributions for the month were \$2,202,420, including \$115,000 from the Monterey Peninsula Foundation for the Morse Foundation Scholarship Fund, \$1,000,000 from the Central Coast VNA and Hospice for the Visiting Nurses Association and Hospice Stewardship Fund II, \$100,000 from the Claire Giannini Fund for the Girls' Health in Girls' Hands program, stock valued at \$152,617 from Marsha McMahan Zelus for the Marsha McMahan Zelus Fund, and stock and cash totaling \$733,835 from the estate of Jean Fitton to establish the Jean P. Fitton Fund.

Grants to agencies for the month totaling \$298,874 were approved and recorded.

Interfund activity for the month totaled \$207,452.
