#### **CALL TO ORDER - Steve McGowan**

Steve McGowan called the regular meeting of the Executive Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:35 PM, Tuesday, September 26, 2017 at the Foundation's Monterey office.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Motion: to approve the July 25, 2017 minutes:

Ken Wright / Patti Hiramoto second. Motion carried unanimously.

### de Guigne Estate Gift

Steve McGowan introduced CFMC board member Rick Kennifer, attorney from Johnson, Fantl & Kennifer, representing the de Guigne Estate.

Rick described the details of the de Guigne Gift which includes a six-acre waterfront property in Pebble Beach and other liquid assets. Rick brought the committee up to date and described the delays from Wells Fargo Bank to accept the trusteeship. Any action to move forward on the de Guigne bequest is at a standstill until Wells Fargo Bank accepts the role of trustee. Wells Fargo has concerns that there is not enough liquidity to pay direct bequests

After a thorough discussion, the Executive Committee decided there is not enough information from Wells Fargo about what is actually needed and directed Rick to inform Wells Fargo the CFMC would not loan funds to pay the direct bequests.

Motion: to approve the decision that the Community Foundation for Monterey County is not willing, at this time, to advance money to payout the shortfall to the beneficiaries named in the de Guigne bequest.

Greg Chilton/ Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

#### RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE - Betsy Buchalter Adler - Call in

Betsy Buchalter Adler highlighted activities in the August Resource Development Summary. Christine Dawson spoke about the August 30 meeting where the gift acceptance policy was discussed. Christine noted the success of the recent donor education series and described the upcoming campaign for Monterey County Gives!.

#### **REPORT OF THE CHAIR - Steve McGowan**

Steve reported the 2017 Celebration of Philanthropy will be October 25 at Corral de Tierra County Club.

Steve informed the Executive Committee that Patti Hiramoto will be leaving the board for a job opportunity in another location. Patti's service on the board was highly praised and she expressed how much the experience meant to her.

#### TREASURERS REPORT-Teri Belli

Teri Belli asked the committee if there were any questions about the August 30 financials. Teri reminded the committee the August 30 financials will be approved at the October board meeting. There were no questions about the financials.

#### **GRANTS AND PROGRAMS COMMITTEE - Patti Hiramoto**

Patti Hiramoto reported there are five donor - advised or other grants over \$50,000 for approval.

#### **INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Ken Petersen**

Ken Peterson reported on the Verus Investment Conference that he and Dan Baldwin attended.

# **GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE - Greg Chilton**

Greg Chilton reported the Nominating Committee met August 7 to examine the board matrix and outline the current mix of skills, demographics, and expertise that CFMC is looking for. Greg listed ten first choice (and backup) candidates that fulfill the areas of estate planning, agriculture, law enforcement, accounting and community action. The 2018 board officers were selected and both the nominations to the board and officers will be confirmed at the October board meeting.

Dan Baldwin reported on the new funds approved since the last meeting.

Dan Baldwin reported on the recent trip to Sacramento with the League of California Community Foundations for an annual meeting with legislator's and the LCCF lobbyist.

### Affordable Housing

Dan updated the committee on the continuing work on affordable housing. Dan is involved with a variety of county organizations and government agencies to develop a coordinated approach to move forward.

#### **Endowment Oversite Committee**

There will be a presentation at the October Board meeting to approve the proposed Endowment Oversite Committee. Dan described the purpose of the new committee as a group of current and past board members that will provide guidance and oversite to ensure the donor's intent is being executed appropriately when there are no active advisors.

#### Impact Investing

Dan updated the committee on Impact Investing with a PowerPoint presentation showing possible next steps to move forward. After a discussion about the researched best practices, possible partnerships and other models available, Dan recommended forming an Impact Investment committee with Nolan Kennedy as chair.

Motion: to approve forming an Impact Investment Committee to develop the parameters for the impact investing process at CFMC.

# COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FOR MONTEREY COUNTY NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the Ten Months Ended October 31, 2017

#### **Assets**

Total Assets through 10/31/2017 are \$229,902,438 a 18.35% increase since October 2016, and a 9.83% increase since December 2016.

# Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2016, plus new 2017 additions.

#### Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized gains were \$9,330, and unrealized gains were \$18,537,926, for a total gain of \$18,547,256.

#### **Operating Fund**

Total revenue was \$37,325 less than the budget, total expenses were \$57,290 less than the budget, the realized gains were \$335 and unrealized gains were \$35,363 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio. The actual net operating deficit is \$221,783 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$277,446.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 4.3 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000.

### **Portfolio Performance**

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 10/31/2017 was \$182,254,863. The year-to-date Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio through October 31, 2017 was 12.9% compared to the Policy Index of 12.2%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 10/31/2017 was \$4,517,490. The year-to-date Total Return for the Medium-Term Fund Portfolio through October 31, 2017 was 9.0% compared to the Policy Index of 8.6%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 10/31/2017 was \$984,326. The year-to-date Total Return for the ESG Fund Portfolio through October 31, 2017 was 12.1% compared to the Policy Index of 12.2%.

# **Special Program Funds**

Special Program Funds include: Community Leadership Project, funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; Pathways to Safety, funded by the ACTION Council of Monterey County; Girl's Health in Girl's Hands, funded by the Claire Giannini Fund, the Peggy and Jack Baskin Foundation, the David and Lucile Packard Foundation and the Monterey Peninsula Foundation; the Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; and the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation.

Total Special Program revenue was \$593,750 and total expenses were \$787,135.
