CALL TO ORDER

Board chair Ken Petersen called the regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:35 PM, Tuesday, December 18, 2018 at the Foundation's Monterey office.

CONSENT AGENDA – Ken Petersen

Ken Petersen asked the board if they had any questions or required clarification on matters related to the consent agenda. There were no questions or concerns.

Motion: to approve the Consent Agenda as presented.

Ken Wright /Jeff Eikenberry second. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR – Ken Petersen

Ken Petersen noted the 2019 board retreat will be Saturday, January 26 at the community foundation's Monterey office. Some suggested topics of interest are advocacy and community leadership around critical issues.

Ken and Dan Baldwin recognized departing board members Ken Wright and Steve McGowan thanking them for their service.

Birt Johnson, Jr. presented Ken Petersen with a gift & congratulated him on a wonderful year as chair.

TREASURERS REPORT-Teri Belli

Teri Belli reviewed 2018 October and November Financials and explained in depth the assets, revenue, operating and grant related expenses. After a thorough discussion about the different line items there was a motion to approve the October and November financials.

Motion: to approve the October 31, 2018 and November 30, 2018 financial statements. Ida Lopez Chan / Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

Teri reviewed the 2019 operating budget and explained the year-end projections, excess revenue over expenses and potential outstanding fees. Teri summarized the current financial transactions between the de Guigne estate trust, Wells Fargo and CFMC and the outlook for 2019. Included, are property taxes and general maintenance. Teri informed the board the budget had been reviewed in detail by the finance committee, and they recommend approval of the 2019 budget as presented.

Motion: to approve the 2019 operating budget, as presented to the board. Ken Wright / Birt Johnson, Jr. second. Motion carried unanimously.

Teri Belli requested approval of Ken Petersen as an additional signatory for CFMC second signatures due to his proximity to the Monterey office.

Motion: to approve Ken Petersen as a 2019 signatory for second signatures on the CFMC checking account. Ken Wright/ Steve McGowan second. Motion passed unanimously.

COMMUNITY IMPACT INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Noian Kennedy

Dan Baldwin commented that the Community Impact Investment committee was formed in 2018, drafted an RFP and successfully implemented two loans within the 10 month period.

Two organizations will receive funding in 2018: California Farmlink and the Opportunity Fund. Farmlink has signed their documents for \$750,000 for 6 months and the Opportunity Fund documents should be complete by year-end.

The committee will be reviewing the 2018 documents and policies to set goals for the direction of future investments.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Steve McGowan - call in

Steve McGowan reported that Verus reviewed the third quarter 2018 investment results and market volatility with the investment committee.

Steve led a conversation regarding the annual spending policy payout percentage. He discussed the importance of keeping the payout consistent and that after a thorough discussion the investment committee recommends a 4.5% payout for the 2019 distribution.

Motion: to approve the recommended 4.5% payout rate for 2019. Steve McGowan / Nolan Kennedy second. Motion passed unanimously.

The committee agreed Verus is doing an excellent job and to continue with their services in 2019. Verus will draft an update to the 2012 Investment Policy Statement to be presented at the February board meeting.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE - Steve McGowan - call-in

Steve McGowan reported that Giff Lehman, Elsa Mendoza Jimenez and Jose Luis Alvarado accepted invitations to join the board in 2019.

Motion: to approve the selected candidates: Giff Lehman, Elsa Mendoza Jimenez and Jose Luis Alvarado to the 2019 board.

Steve McGowan / Ken Wright second. Motion passed unanimously.

Birt Johnson, Jr., Teri Belli, Betsy Buchalter Adler and Bill Sharpe have agreed to serve a second term. Motion: to approve Birt Johnson, Jr., Teri Belli, Betsy Buchalter Adler and Bill Sharpe's second terms.

Ken Wright / Betsey Pearson second. Motion passed unanimously.

Motion: to approve the 2019 board officers: Chair-Birt Johnson, Jr., Vice Chair-Teri Belli, Secretary-Jeff Eikenberry, Treasurer-Jan Vanderbilt. Ken Wright / Betsey Pearson second. Motion passed unanimously.

GRANTS AND PROGRAMS – Birt Johnson, Jr.

Birt Johnson, Jr., requested approval of the October 1 – November 30, 2018 grants.

Motion: to approve 298 grants awarded from October 1 – November 30, 2018, totaling \$3,094,001.

Ken Wright / Ida Lopez Chan second. Motion carried unanimously.

Birt Johnson, Jr. requested approval of the Fall Cycle Community Impact Grants in the categories of 1) Arts, Culture and Historic Preservation and 2) Community Development, 3) Environment, and, 4) Animal Welfare. The two grant committees are recommending 32 grants. Including the small CI grants (up to \$12,000 each, which are reviewed and approved by staff), the total CI Fall Cycle grants are: 43 grants totaling \$947,267

Motion: to approve the 2018 Fall Cycle Community Impact Grants. 43 grants totaling, \$947,267.00

Christine Dawson reviewed how the donor advised funds grants are good examples of how donor advisor giving and co-investment can enhance CFMC initiatives and expand philanthropic impact.

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT - Betsy Buchalter Adler - call in

Betsy Buchalter Adler reported on the November Resource Development Summary.

Christine Dawson reported the MC Gives campaign had reached \$3.7 million to date and is 10% above the 2017 campaign.

The Resource Development committee had an in-depth discussion about the philanthropic services goals for 2019. They will keep their top priority "to educate the public about philanthropy."

Business Meeting

2018 Year in Review – Dan Baldwin, Christine Dawson

Dan Baldwin went through a PowerPoint presentation that recapped 2018 highlights and accomplishments. The presentation highlighted how CFMC is growing dramatically with a comparison of grants, scholarships, assets and contributions from 2010 to 2018. Christine Dawson reviewed the philanthropic services and activities. She focused on the gifts, funds, leadership goals, education and services offered in 2018.

Community Leadership Past, Present and Future

Dan Baldwin reviewed the third pillar of the CFMC strategic plan, *Community Leadership*. He described the differences of re-active, pro-active and external community leadership roles CFMC has played in the last 10 years.

He looked forward to issues of affordable housing, homelessness, census counts and community impact investing and explained the ways CFMC is involved in both advocacy and facilitation of current events.

Foundation Scenarios - Breakouts

Dan divided the board and staff into 4 groups. Each group was given a different scenario and was asked to discuss the issues and provide a solution to their scenario. The topics were: affordable housing, homeless shelters, the Outreach Fund, and donor advised funds. The stories were very close to actual issues facing the CFMC today. After the breakout, each group presented their scenario, discussed their issues and made recommendations.

CFMC Ambassadors

The board learned ways they can use talking points to describe how we work and simple ways to introduce people to the CFMC.

Birt wrapped up the meeting by talking about the board members responsibilities and the exciting year ahead.

On a motion by Loren Steck, seconded by Bill Sharpe, the November 12, 2018 minutes were approved as written.

Verus

Ken then passed the meeting to Anne Westreich to discuss the performance report, the revised IPS and the proposed work plan.

Anne brought the committee a draft of the revised IPS. She reviewed the changes and additions to the IPS from the previous meeting. As they read through the proposed IPS there was a discussion about the updates. They also identified several other changes that were needed. The committee agreed that the IPS needed further review and asked Anne to incorporate the changes to the IPS and present it at the next meeting. There was a discussion about active and passive management of the portfolio.

Dan reviewed the value of the committee and the asset allocation strategy in the CFMC's interaction with donors and the public. These should be taken into account as the committee considers IPS changes.

Anne then reviewed the work plan for the year.

Anne reviewed the fourth quarter 2018 investment results.

The market value of the Total Fund portfolio at 12/31/2018 was \$166,836,639. The YTD returns were -5.6% compared to the policy benchmark of -5.3%.

The market value of the Medium-Term portfolio at 12/31/2018 was \$4,597,540. The YTD returns were -3.3% compared to the policy benchmark of -3.3%.

The market value of the ESG portfolio at 12/31/2018 was \$3,302,467. The YTD returns were -4.9% compared to the policy benchmark of -5.1%.

Call to Order: The regular meeting of the Grants and Programs Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County (CFMC) was called to order at 9:01 AM by Ida Lopez Chan at the CFMC's Monterey office.

Approval of the October 3, 2018 minutes: Motion: Betsy Buchalter Adler/Second: Birt Johnson, Jr.; motion carried.

1. Welcome and Introductions

Ida welcomed everyone and introductions were made. Ida reviewed the 2019 Grants and Programs committee calendar, Community Impact grant subcommittee rosters and calendar.

2. Grants and Programs - Updates

a. 2018 Overview

Laurel Lee-Alexander presented an overview of the CFMC's grantmaking in 2018. Highlights include:

- Grants awarded in 2018: \$18.7M; Community Impact and Field of Interest grants: \$2.195M (12% of the total); Donor Advised grants: \$12.7M (68% of the total)
- Number of grants awarded in 2017: 1,887 (compared to 1,658 in 2017).
- Donor advised grants as a percentage of total grants grew from 60% in 2017 to 68% in 2018.
- The Small CI grant request amount has been increased to \$15,000 (from \$12,000).
- Feedback about the streamlined and shortened grant application process from NGP grantees and applicants was overwhelmingly positive.
- The James Irvine Foundation (JIF) Pilot Re-granting project in Salinas was initiated and continues with nine groups focused on low-income resident engagement and opportunities in Salinas. The CFMC is using the "wraparound services" model that combines multi-year operating/program support, an assigned coach/mentor and peer learning opportunities.

The committee discussed opportunities for assessing the Community Impact grantmaking model.

Kaki Rusmore provided an overview of the Center for Nonprofit Excellence (CNE). Highlights include:

- 2019 is the third and final year of the Next Steps for Small Nonprofits program.
- After a year-long break from conducting the Leadership Development and Education Institute (LEAD) program to assess the program and strengthen the LEAD Alumni group, the CNE is leading the program with 18 nonprofit staff members.

b. Spring Cycle Grant Programs

Janet Shing, Director of Grantmaking, gave an update on the 2019 Spring Community Impact Grants program. The CFMC received 47 CI applications requesting a total of \$1,733,480. Small Community Impact grant applications are due March 1. The Neighborhood Grants Program (NGP) applications are due February 15.

3. Overview: Funding Sources for Competitive Grantmaking

Laurel Lee-Alexander shared an overview of the fund allocations process for CFMC grantmaking programs. Field of Interest funds and Unrestricted funds fuel our competitive our grantmaking programs, and we match available funding with donor intent. The draft 2019 recommended allocations were shared prior to the upcoming Board meeting.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned by Ida Lopez Chan at 10:30 AM.

Karen stated that they would be in-house February 19-22. A draft audit will be ready by April 1st, to allow time for the Audit Committee to review, and a final presentation to the board will be made on April 23, 2019.

Discussion Items

Karen asked Dan Baldwin for an update on the Dan and Lillian King Foundation. There were no updates as the matter was settled in 2017. Dan agreed to help write the footnotes for audit for the King Foundation and the de Guigne property.

Having no further business, staff was excused and the committee went into executive session.




Long-term Fund






Mid-term Fund

Assets

Total Assets through 12/31/2018 are \$248,646,102 a 7.02% decrease since December 2017.

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2018.

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized gains were \$126,154, and unrealized losses were \$14,040,027, for a total loss of \$13,913,874.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$544,498 less than the budget, and total expenses were \$58,695 less than the budget, the realized gains were \$1,010 and the unrealized losses were \$36,228 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio. The actual net operating surplus is \$154,610 compared to a budgeted surplus of \$675,631.

The budgeted operating revenue assumed \$500,000 in Bequest revenue and \$35,625 in Admin Fee revenue for the de Guigne property. Excluding those amounts, total revenue was \$8,270 less than the budget, with Admin Fee revenue being only \$40,419 under budget.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 5.7 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000 the de Guigne bequest.

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 12/31/2018 was \$166,285,532. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was -5.6% compared to the Policy Index of -5.4%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 12/31/2018 was \$4,588,954. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was -3.3% compared to the Policy Index of -2.9%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 12/31/2018 was \$3,302,911. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was -5.0% compared to the Policy Index of -5.1%.

The market value of the DRIM Fund portfolio at 12/31/2018 was \$2,556,677. The Total Return for the DRIM Portfolio, since inception, was 1.1% compared to the Policy Index of -6.9%. Due to the timing of the DRIM reports, there is a one-month lag in the performance reporting.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Pathways to Safety, funded by the ACTION Council of Monterey County; the Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation; the Monterey County Development Professionals, funded with the remaining assets from the dissolution of the Development Executive Network, to be used for professional development for people new to the fundraising field, and networking among those involved in fund development; and the Salinas Leadership project, funded by the James Irvine Foundation.

Beginning in 2018, the Monterey Count Gives campaign is included as a Special Program. Total new contributions for the campaign were \$4,286,502 and total interfund contributions were \$958,527.

Total Special Program revenue was \$7,236,378 and total expenses were \$727,843.

Assets

Total Assets through 1/31/2019 are \$257,354,162 a 5.92% decrease since January 2018 and a 3.50% increase since December 2018.

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2018.

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized gains were \$266, and unrealized gains were \$9,123,079, for a total gain of \$9,123,345.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$15,074 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$4,488 less than the budget, unrealized gains were \$17,293 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio. The actual net operating deficit is \$213,595 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$250,450.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 4.8 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000 the de Guigne bequest.

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 1/31/2019 was \$175,141,025. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was -3.5% compared to the Policy Index of -2.9%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 1/31/2019 was \$4,990,661. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was -1.5% compared to the Policy Index of -.08%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 1/31/2019 was \$3,457,036. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was -3.3% compared to the Policy Index of -2.9%.

The market value of the DRIM Fund portfolio at 1/31/2019 was \$2,740,820. The Total Return for the DRIM Portfolio, since inception, was -6.6% compared to the Policy Index of -11.9%. Due to the timing of the DRIM reports, there is a one-month lag in the performance reporting.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Pathways to Safety, funded by the ACTION Council of Monterey County; the Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation; the Monterey County Development Professionals, funded with the remaining assets from the dissolution of the

Development Executive Network, to be used for professional development for people new to the fundraising field, and networking among those involved in fund development; and the Salinas Leadership project, funded by the James Irvine Foundation; and the Monterey County Gives annual campaign.

Total Special Program revenue was \$367,936 and total expenses were \$38,613.

Proposed Fund Allocations for CFMC Grant Programs - 2019

UNRESTRICTED FUNDS

The beginning balance of the Unrestricted (which includes the General Endowment) and Field of Interest (FOI) funds available for grantmaking is: \$2,528,832

- Available from FOI funds: \$1,934,145
- Available from Unrestricted funds (including \$340,419 from the General Endowment): \$594,687

After the following disbursements are allocated from the Unrestricted funds, **\$2,383,201.50** is available for Community Impact (CI) grantmaking.

1. \$145,630.51:

- \$10,693.10 for the Opportunity Fund (plus carryover from 2018):
 - \$100,000 for Opportunity and Organizational Development grants to support small grants (typically less than \$5,000) for organizational development, emerging ventures and urgent needs.
 - \$50,000 for CEO Discretionary Grants for CFMC grants to support timesensitive needs
- \$49,937.41 to the Neighborhood Grants Program (plus carryover from 2018 = \$50,000 for grantmaking) – for small grants to grassroots, mostly voluntary associations of neighborhood residents coming together around community improvement efforts.
- \$50,000 to support Monterey Bay Economic Partnership's program expansion for affordable housing research and planning (second year of a three-year grant).
- \$15,500 for various grants (MC Gives! awards and match: \$14,500; Philanthropy Day awards: \$1,000).
- \$10,000 for the Distinguished Trustee Award for designated grant to an organization to be chosen by the Community Foundation's 2017 Distinguished Trustee.
- \$9,500 for CFMC Employee Matching Gift program (\$500 allocated for each of 19 employees).
