MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER – Birt Johnson, Jr.

Birt Johnson called the regular meeting of the Executive Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:35 on July 16, 2019 at the Foundation's Salinas office. Birt welcomed Nolan Kennedy, the chair of the Community Impact Investment Committee, which Birt designated as a standing committee and part of the executive committee going forward.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion: to approve the May 28, 2019 executive committee minutes as written. Ida Lopez Chan /Jeff Eikenberry second. Motion carried unanimously

REPORT OF THE CHAIR – Birt Johnson, Jr.

Birt reported the Celebration of Philanthropy will be October 30, 2019 at Corral de Tierra County Club. Lydia Villareal has agreed to receive the Distinguished Trustee Award.

Birt informed the executive committee that Jeff Eikenberry is moving out of the area and will resign after the August 27 board meeting.

TREASURERS REPORT - Jan Vanderbilt

Jan Vanderbilt reported the June and July financial statements will be reviewed and approved at the August board meeting.

GRANTS AND PROGRAMS COMMITTEE – Ida Lopez Chan

Ida Lopez Chan recommended approval of the donor advised, interfund transfers and other grants over \$50,000.

 Harles R. Sarmont College Endowment Fund (Interfund) Fund: College Futures Monterey County Fund Amount: \$162,326.66 Purpose: scholarships The College Futures Monterey County Fund Fund: College Futures Monterey County Fund Amount: \$200,000 Purpose: scholarships

 Lori and Lou Flagg Memorial Youth Fund Agency: Boys and Girls Clubs of Monterey County Amount: \$50,000
 Purpose: Donation adding to the \$1,000,000 match for the 50th Anniversary Campaign

Motion: to approve the grants from the Harles R. Sarmont College Endowment Fund to the College Futures Monterey County Fund for \$162,326.66, The College Futures Monterey County Fund to The College Futures Monterey County Fund for \$200,000 and Lori and Lou Flagg Memorial Youth Fund to the Boys and Girls Clubs of Monterey County for \$50,000.

Ida Lopez Chan / Nolan Kennedy second. Motion carried unanimously

Laurel Lee-Alexander reported the Endowment Stewardship Committee met July 15. They discovered the Harles R. Sarmont Fund had an incomplete motion from October 2015.

Excerpt from the October 27, 2015 Board meeting minutes with needed text in red:

PRESIDENTS REPORT – Dan Baldwin

"Dan described the Harles R. Sarment College Endowment is the CFMC's largest scholarship fund, with a \$2.2 million balance and over \$100,000 in scholarships awarded each year to graduating high school seniors throughout Monterey County. The criteria were written many years ago, and they called for the scholarships to be tuition only.

Dan recommends the CFMC Board exercise its power of variance to change the criteria to the following:

"Only the income from the fund may be used and, when used, shall be used for the exclusive purpose of providing tuition scholarships to persons who meet all of the following five qualifications:

- 1. Graduating high school senior.
- 2. Resident of Monterey County.
- 3. United States citizen.
- 4. Admitted as a full-time student into a <u>two-year or</u> four-year college or university in the United States for the first academic year following graduation.
- 5. Otherwise financially unable to attend such a college or university."

Motion: to approve the CFMC board exercise its power of variance to adjust the language in the Harles R. Sarment College Endowment and change the word "tuition" to "scholarships and add "two-year or" to Criteria #4."

Ida Lopez Chan/ Jeff Eikenberry second. Motion carried unanimously

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE – Ken Petersen

Ken reported on the portfolio reviews and performance allocations for the Long Term, ESG and Medium Term portfolios.

The committee's next meeting is August 12, when the draft of the 2019 Investment Policy Statement will be reviewed. Steve Dart, Anne Westritch, Ken Petersen and Dan Baldwin have been preparing

the new draft. It will go before the executive committee in November and the board in December for approval.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE – Dan Baldwin for Ken Petersen

Dan reported the committee will meet August 13 to review the survey results and outline the skill sets needed for 2020 board members. They will meet in September and October if necessary, to finalize potential board candidates.

The committee will recommend a new secretary for approval at the August board meeting to take Jeff Eikenberry's position.

COMMUNITY IMPACT INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Nolan Kennedy

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE – Christine Dawson for Michael Reid

The resource development committee met June 26 and focused on misconceptions and myths that linger from the past around the CFMC. The committee will create a sub-committee to work on strategies to address the issues.

NEW FUND APPROVALS – Dan Baldwin

Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust

• The Brooks Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust

Dan described the new CRAT created by Steve and Barbara Brooks that includes real estate in Carmel, CA. He outlined the obligations created by the 7% annuity when the CFMC is the trustee. After a thorough discussion the committee agreed to approve accepting the role of trustee for the Brooks CRAT.

Motion: to approve The Brooks Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust. Ken Petersen / Teri Belli second. Motion carried unanimously

PRESIDENT/CEO REPORT - Dan Baldwin

75th Anniversary

Dan informed the committee that staff research shows the CFMC will have its 75th Anniversary in 2020. Dan proposed the staff and board engage past chairs and board members as an advisory committee to set the direction of the anniversary and aspirations of the CFMC looking forward.

Motion: to create an advisory for the CFMC's 75th Anniversary.

Ken Petersen / Teri Belli second. Motion carried unanimously

Dan reported the highlights of the Past Chairs luncheon was the continual commitment and goodwill shared by the CFMC's past chairs.

Advocacy Guidelines

The committee discussed the proposed advocacy guidelines at length. Dan noted the CFMC does not have a formal set of guidelines and as we move into a more public profile, the guidelines will tell the CFMC how and when to act.

A recommendation was made to present the advocacy guidelines to the board at the August 27 meeting for approval. The committee would like the documents sent out early and time allotted at the meeting for a presentation and discussion about some of the critical points and IRS standard statements.

Motion: to recommend the advocacy guidelines for approval, with a presentation and discussion, to the board at the August 27, 2019 meeting. Jan Vanderbilt / Jeff Eikenberry second. Motion carried unanimously

CEO Goals

Dan reported on the progress of his 2019 goals. He summarized the topics of; advocacy, leadership, community impact investing, affiliate funds, DAF's, College Futures and Census 2020 and general operations.

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COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FOR MONTEREY COUNTY NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the Eight Months Ended August 31, 2019

<u>Assets</u>

Total Assets through 8/31/2019 are \$266,591,806 a .77% increase since August 2018 and a 7.22% increase since December 2018.

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2018. In August, there was an addition to the Evelyn Torras CRT with the contribution of a house in Carmel Valley valued at \$1,375,000, and a calculated remainder value to the CFMC of \$274,817. Other remainder beneficiaries include Montage, Salvation Army and Meals on Wheels. Evelyn's two brothers are the beneficiaries of the CRT.

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized losses were \$3,005, and unrealized gains were \$16,200,872, for a total gain of \$16,197,867.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$147,192 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$66,276 less than the budget, unrealized gains were \$44,949 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio. The actual net operating deficit is \$311,537 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$569,703.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 4.3 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000.

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 8/31/2019 was \$191,254,359. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 1.2% compared to the Policy Index of 2.5%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 8/31/2019 was \$7,307,083. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 5.2% compared to the Policy Index of 6.0%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 8/31/2019 was \$3,678,773. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 3.8% compared to the Policy Index of 4.0%.

The market value of the DRIM Fund portfolio at 8/31/2019 was \$2,780,271. The Total Return for the DRIM Portfolio, since inception, was 5.4% compared to the Policy Index of -6.4%. Due to the timing of the DRIM reports, there is a one-month lag in the performance reporting.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Pathways to Safety, funded by the ACTION Council of Monterey County; the Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation; the Monterey County Development Professionals, funded with the remaining assets from the dissolution of the Development Executive Network, to be used for professional development for people new to the fundraising field, and networking

among those involved in fund development; and the Salinas Leadership project, funded by the James Irvine Foundation; and the Monterey County Gives annual campaign.

Total Special Program revenue was \$383,421 and total expenses were \$5,770,214, which includes grants totaling \$5,295,709 from the 2018 Monterey County Gives campaign.

We are filing a Claim Against County of Monterey in the amount of \$535,167.73 for property taxes paid on 3200-3204 17 Mile Drive, Pebble Beach CA.

On the advice of the Monterey County Assessor's office, we are making clear this filing is a claim and not an appeal. This claim is based on the July 11, 2019 Welfare or Veterans' Organization Exemption Assessor's Finding on Qualification of Property Use in which the Monterey County Assessor's Office marked N.E.U. as the requirement not met. N.E.U. states that the "Property is not used exclusively for religious, hospital, or charitable purposes within the meaning of section 214 of the Revenue and Taxation Code."

The Community Foundation for Monterey County ("CFMC") is a public charity described in Sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code. CFMC's specific charitable purpose, as stated in its Articles of Incorporation, is "to receive, distribute and provide funds and services to charitable organizations for the benefit of persons and communities within Monterey County, California." CFMC achieves this charitable purpose mainly by receiving contributions and making grants, thus serving as a bridge between donors and Monterey County charitable programs operated by other organizations.

The Properties are currently owned by the LLC, which, along with its sole member, the CFMC, is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes; neither is organized for profit or allows any private inurement; the LLC is using the Properties exclusively for the purpose of liquidating them to

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Daniel R. Baldwin President/CEO fund CFMC's charitable grantmaking program, which is CFMC's charitable function.
