#### **GRANTMAKING 2019**

- More than \$19.2 million granted
- Surpassed \$200 million cumulative grantmaking
- The James Irvine Foundation regranting program: Convened nine Salinas-based grantees to grow economic opportunity and civic engagement (3-year grants & capacity building to 10 nonprofits)
- College Futures Monterey County Awarded final grant from College Futures Foundation and planned implementation with CSUMB

- Awarded 371 scholarships totaling \$1,406,500 Million

- \$23,846 (non-endowed) and \$49,786 (endowed)




## PHILANTHROPIC SERVICES 2019 Affiliate Funds




# ORGANIZATIONAL EXCELLENCE 2019 Diversity, Equity, Inclusion (DEI)
