CALL TO ORDER

Board chair Birt Johnson, Jr. called the regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:35 PM, Tuesday, December 17, 2019 at the Foundation's Monterey office.

CONSENT AGENDA – Birt Johnson, Jr.

Birt Johnson asked the board if they had any questions or required clarification on matters related to the consent agenda. There were no questions or comments.

Motion: to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Jose Luis Alvarado / Teri Belli second. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR – Birt Johnson, Jr.

Birt Johnson noted the 2020 board retreat will be Saturday, January 18 at the community foundation's Monterey office. Some suggested topics of interest to the board are: the strategic plan review, CF 101 and community leadership around critical issues.

Birt and Dan recognized departing board members Ken Petersen and Bill Mitchell thanking them for their service and professional expertise.

Ida Lopez Chan presented highlights from the results of the 2019 Board self-assessment survey put together with subcommittee members Birt Johnson, Maija West and Nolan Kennedy. The survey responses were positive with comments for more education and training and a continued priority for greater diversity on the board.

TREASURER/FINANCE COMMITTEE – Jan Vanderbilt

Jan reviewed the November financial statements. She focused on contributions, revenue, operating and grant related expenses. After a thorough discussion, there was a motion to approve the October and November 2019 financials.

Motion: to approve the October 31 and November 30, 2019 financial statements. Jan Vanderbilt / Ida Lopez Chan second. Motion carried unanimously.

Operating Budget 2020

Jan reviewed the 2020 operating budget and explained the year-end projections, excess revenue over expenses and salary compensations. Jan informed the board the budget had been reviewed in detail by the finance committee and was recommended for approval as presented.

Motion: to approve the 2020 operating budget, as presented to the board. Jan Vanderbilt / Elsa Mendoza Jimenez second. Motion carried unanimously.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE – Ken Petersen

Ken Petersen reported the 2012 CFMC Investment Policy Statement (IPS) has been revised by the appointed team of Dan Baldwin, Steve Dart, Giff Lehman and Anne Westreich from Verus. The 2019 IPS has been extensively reviewed by the investment committee and is recommended for approval.

Motion: to approve the 2019 Investment Policy Statement as presented. Bill Sharpe /Erika Padilla-Chavez second. Motion carried unanimously.

Ken described how the investment committee decides on the annual s payout percentage from the endowed funds. He discussed the importance of keeping the percentage consistent. The investment committee's recommendation for 2020 is 4.5%.

Motion: to approve the investment committee's recommendation for a 4.5% payout rate for 2019.

Nolan Kennedy / Michael Reid second. Motion carried unanimously.

Ken reviewed the Long Term, Medium Term and ESG portfolios investment results.

Ken welcomed Giff Lehman as the new chair of the investment committee for 2020.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE – Ken Petersen

Dan Baldwin reported Kirk Gafill from Big Sur and Joe Pezinni from North County accepted invitations to join the board in 2020. The governance committee will have another round of nominations in the Spring of 2020 to add 1-2 more members.

Motion: to approve the selected candidates Kirk Gafill and Joe Pezzini to the 2020 board. Erika Padilla-Chavez / Jose Luis Alvarado second. Motion passed unanimously.

Betsey Pearson, Nolan Kennedy and Fred Meurer have agreed to serve a second term. The 2020 officers elect are: Chair-Birt Johnson, Jr., Vice Chair-Teri Belli, Secretary-Maija West, and Treasurer-Jan Vanderbilt. They all accepted their nominations.

Motion: to approve Betsey Pearson, Nolan Kennedy and Fred Meurer second terms. And approve the 2020 officers: Chair-Birt Johnson, Jr., Vice Chair-Teri Belli, Secretary-Maija West, and Treasurer-Jan Vanderbilt.

Erika Padilla-Chavez / Jose Luis Alvarado second. Motion passed unanimously. GRANTS AND PROGRAMS – Ida Lopez Chan

Ida Lopez Chan requested approval of the October 31 through November 30, 2019 grants. There are 373 grants totaling \$3,834,570.

Motion: to approve the 373 grants totaling \$3,834,570 for October 31 through November 30, 2019.

Abby Taylor-Silva / Elsa Mendoza Jimenez second. Motion carried unanimously.

Ida Lopez Chan requested approval of the Fall Cycle Community Impact Grants in the categories of 1) Arts, Culture and Historic Preservation and 2) Community Development, Environment and Animal Welfare. The two grant committees are recommending 29 grants. Including the small CI grants (up to \$12,000 each, which are reviewed and approved by staff), the total CI Fall Cycle grants are: 29 grants totaling \$838,453.

Motion: to approve the 2019 Fall Cycle Community Impact Grants. 29 grants totaling \$838,453. Elsa Mendoza Jimenez / Bill Mitchell second. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE – Michael Reid

Michael Reid thanked the resource development department for all the work they do to get information and resources to the board, donors and community.

MC Gives campaign has reached \$3.9 million to date and is slightly above the 2018 campaign.

Steve and Barbara Brooks, local CRT fund holders and Kevin Mahoney from Integris will speak at the 2020 Legacy Lunch on February 4, 2020 at the Monterey Plaza Hotel.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT – Dan Baldwin

Dan sent an electronic report to the board prior to the meeting.

Real Estate Update

Dan reviewed a PowerPoint of the recent real estate sales by the CFMC; 3200 17 Mile Drive, Pebble Beach, Palmeroo Trust in Los Gatos, the Brooks Home CRT in Carmel and the Torres Trust on Rotunda Drive, Carmel. There was discussion about the variations in price, due diligence and work involved with each property.

The CFMC is still in discussions with the County of Monterey over the property taxes paid during the time of CFMC ownership of 3200/04 17 Mile Drive (\$762,421). CFMC filed a claim for a tax- exempt status which is under review by the County of Monterey Board of Supervisors. The supervisors are waiting for an opinion letter from the State Board of Equalization. The CFMC and the County have a "tolling agreement" that allows for no action to be taken until the opinion is rendered.

AB 1712

Dan reviewed AB1712, the legislation that has been proposed to regulate donor-advised funds (DAFs) in California . AB-1712 is still open to amendment and will have to move through the Assembly by early 2020 or die. Dan reviewed the importance of this moment in the judiciary committee's decision-making process (January 3, 2020 deadline) and requested the board's approval for Dan to send a letter of concern on CFMC letterhead to Sacramento by January 3, 2020.

Motion: to approve a non-board approved letter of concern from Dan Baldwin representing the CFMC and questioning the AB1712 position.

During the discussion, it was acknowledged that a board approved letter would add more leverage to the CFMC's message. Abby Taylor Silva made a recommendation for an amended motion to give the board the chance to support the letter by an email vote.

Amended Motion: to provide a draft letter by December 28, 2019 to the CFMC board for approval of the language as written to the judiciary committee. If the letter is not approved by a unanimous vote, the letter can be revised and sent as a non-board approved comment from Dan Baldwin, CFMC CEO.

Jose Luis Alvarado/ Giff Lehman second. Motion carried unanimously.

MILPA

Dan updated the board on the nonprofit MILPA. Dan has had several conversations with people close to the situation and has been in communication with other funders. MILPA is scheduled to receive a second-year grant from the Irvine Funds through CFMC. It was agreed that the grant would be held until the December board meeting, when staff will make a recommendation on whether to provide continued funding.

Laurel Lee- Alexander passed out a summary of the actions taken by MILPA leadership, trusted advisors, community leaders and other funders. Dan and Laurel outlined the research and reasoning used to support their recommendation to continue funding MILPA in 2020.

Motion: to continue with the year two granting of \$38,000 through the CFMC from the James Irvine Foundation to MILPA for organizational development and sustainability planning for 2020. Nolan Kennedy/Betsey Pearson second. Motion carried unanimously.

The board went into Executive Session at 5:30 PM.

2019 Year in Review – Dan Baldwin

Dan Baldwin went through a PowerPoint presentation that recapped 2019 highlights and accomplishments. The presentation highlighted how CFMC is growing and moved into a historic overview with comparisons of grants, scholarships, assets and contributions from 2010 to 2019.

Strategic Plan- Review and Framing- Dan Baldwin

Dan Baldwin reviewed the 2015 CFMC strategic plan. Dan set the framework for a discussion about the current strategic plan and whether it is still relevant. There was discussion about how CFMC uses the strategic plan to inform and operationalize the principles day to day. The board was asked to consider whether the document needed a complete overhaul or make updates to improve what we have.

Group - Breakouts

Dan divided board and staff into 4 groups. Each group was given a different pillar of the strategic plan and asked to discuss the language, consider what's missing and future aspirations. After the breakout, each group presented their thoughts and recommendations.

Next Steps: Dan will draft a revised strategic plan based on the work and recommendations completed at the retreat. The draft will be discussed at a future board meeting.

The meeting of the Finance Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County was called to order by Jan Vanderbilt at 2:04PM on December 17, 2019.

<u>Minutes</u>

On a motion by Birt Johnson, Jr., seconded by Fred Meurer, the October 22, 2019 and November 26, 2019 minutes were approved to stand as written.

Financial Statement Review

Jan led a discussion on the October and November Financial Statements. She focused on the November 2019 YTD Consolidated Statement of Financial Position and the operating revenue/expenses versus budget.

On a motion by Teri Belli, seconded by Fred Meurer, the committee approved the October 2019 and November 2019 Financial Statements.

2020 Operating Budget

Jan and Diane Nonella reviewed the final draft of the 2020 Operating Budget, which shows revenues of \$3,655,490 and expenses of \$3,580,490, for a net surplus of \$75,000.

The committee discussed the updates, and at the conclusion on a motion by Birt Johnson, Jr., seconded by Fred Meurer, the committee approved forwarding the budget, as presented, to the full board for final approval.

Discussion Items

Dan Baldwin reviewed the accomplishments of 2019 and brought the committee up to date on our 75th Anniversary plan for 2020.

The committee reviewed their 2020 goals:

- Increase number of committee members
- Operating Reserve annual review
 - consider restricting a portion of the 2019 year-end surplus, based on cash on hand requirements of the policy
- Continuing board education of the CFMC finances
- Document conditions under which a deficit budget may be appropriate create guiding principles
- Determine if a banking RFP is necessary, since Rabobank has been sold

It was decided to move forward with a banking RFP. The committee asked that Dan and Diane provide the committee with the RFP and a list of potential banks for the next meeting.

The regular meeting of the Investment Committee (IC) of the Community Foundation for Monterey County was called to order by Dan Baldwin at 3:12 PM on February 10, 2020.

<u>Minutes</u>

On a motion by Loren Steck, seconded by Birt Johnson, Jr., the November 4, 2019 minutes were approved.

<u>Verus</u>

Anne Westreich presented the Performance Report for the Long Term Portfolio, Medium Term Portfolio, ESG Portfolio, DRIM and Community Impact Investments.

Anne introduced John Nicolini and reviewed ASB Realty's performance. They noted that their performance has lagged due to Barney's bankruptcy and their narrow geographical concentration in 24 hour markets (New York, San Francisco, Los Angeles, etc.). The population has moved to outer communities. John provided information regarding REIT's and Real Estate investments. There was an in-depth discussion about Commodities, Infrastructure and Real Estate. The committee decided to table any investment change in Commodities, Infrastructure and Real Estate until they had more information.

Anne reviewed the fourth quarter 2019 investment results.

The market value of the Long-Term portfolio at 12/31/2019 was \$227,546,173. The YTD returns were 17.7% compared to the policy benchmark of 18.3%.

The market value of the Medium-Term portfolio at 12/31/2019 was \$7,613,971. The YTD returns were 14.3% compared to the policy benchmark of 14.4%.

The market value of the ESG portfolio at 12/31/2019 was \$3,834,302. The YTD returns were 18.4% compared to the policy benchmark of 19.8%.

The committee agreed on a work plan for the next meeting. They asked Anne to provide further research on

- REIT's versus real Estate
- Advantages/Disadvantages of active and passive investing in Infrastructure investments
- Equity Portfolio Structure

Call to Order: The regular meeting of the Grants and Programs Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County (CFMC) was called to order at 9:02 AM by Ida Lopez Chan at the CFMC's Monterey office.

Approval of the October 2, 2019 minutes: Motion: Betsy Buchalter Adler/Second: Birt Johnson, Jr., motion carried.

1. Welcome and Introductions

Ida welcomed everyone and reviewed the calendar for 2020.

- 2. Grants and Programs Updates
 - a) 2019 Overview Community Impact and changes for 2020

Laurel presented an overview of grantmaking in 2019, noting that \$1.9M of the \$19.2M in grantmaking were Community Impact (CI) grants. Ida and Laurel reviewed the timeline and programmatic revisions for the CI program in 2020 agreed upon in 2019.

b) 2020 Re-envisioning

Ida led a discussion about the goal: Re-envision CFMC's largest competitive grantmaking program (Community Impact) to improve efficiencies in the deployment of funds. Reasons for re-envisioning include:

- The growth in grantmaking since 2011 has been driven by non-competitive (Donor Advised) grants.
- While the CFMC has made some process improvements for the competitive grantmaking programs including the Community Impact (CI) program the structure and process have remained the same.
- Restructuring the CI process will allow the CFMC's to expand alignment around Community Leadership, a "pillar" of the Strategic Plan.

c) Evolution

The committee discussed the proposed ideas and agreed to the concept, pending process recommendations from staff.

The Community Impact Investment Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County was called to order by Nolan Kennedy at 3:30 PM on February 13, 2020.

Minutes

On a motion by Loren Steck, seconded by Birt Johnson, Jr., the August 19, 2019 minutes were approved.

Discussion Items

Nolan turned the meeting over to Dan Baldwin.

Dan informed the committee that Opportunity Fund was merging with Accion U.S. Network. He then asked Phil Carey to talk about his research regarding the document and merger. Phil informed the committee that Opportunity Fund currently has 69 loans totaling \$1.26 million in Monterey County. They have also funded 33 loans for \$783,000 since we granted our loan in December 2018. Opportunity Fund is merging with Accion U.S. Network and is asking for approval for the new entity, Accion Opportunity Fund to replace Opportunity Fund as the borrower. Combining forces will give them the largest national micro lending platform, a recognized national brand (Accion) with access to Midwest and East coast funding partners, adds 3 million in new assets with no loans and Opportunity Fund management remains in control. They also have a local development strategy and loan team for our area. The committee discussed the information in detail. Nolan spoke to the proposed loan Guaranty and Loan Amendment and had no objections to the document.

On a motion by Loren Steck, seconded by Birt Johnson, Jr., the committee approved for Dan to sign the Guaranty and Loan Amendment dated 1/16/2020.

Dan reviewed a new proposal from California Coastal Rural Development Corporation (Cal Coastal). Normally we would have asked Jeff Rawlings to complete the underwriting, but he is currently on the board of Cal Coastal. Dan asked Phil to present his financial analysis of Cal Coastal.

Possitive Points:

- Outstanding Loans have increased from \$6.1 million in 2015 to \$8.2 million in 2019
- Revenue has increased every year over the past 5 years
- Loan loss reserves are \$1.2 million
- Most loan origination have an 85-95% loan guarantee from SBA (Small Business Administration) or USDA FSA (US Department of Agriculture Farm Service Agency)
- In 2019 they processed 90 loans for \$33.3 million

Areas of Concern:

- Large write offs in 2019 due to poor performance in strawberry farming
- Cash position is 2.4 million less in 2019. Possibly due to timing of loan sales to SBA
- Loan Loss rate of 2.61% in 2019

The committee discussed the financial results and Bill Tebbe confirmed that strawberry faming has been challenging for lenders. It was also noted that some of those losses could be recovered in future years. The committee decided to move forward with a \$1 million loan, with a 5 year term, rate of 2.5%, and a Loan Loss rate maximum of 2.25%. They asked Dan and Phil to review December 31, 2019 financials.

On a motion by Bill Tebbe, seconded by Birt Johnson, Jr., the committee approved for Dan to finalize a \$1 million loan, with a 5 year term, rate of 2.5%, and a Loan Loss rate maximum of 2.25%.

Dan then led the committee on a discussion about possible future investments. He also reviewed the availability of funds for future investments. The committee came up with the following ideas:

Direct Loans for Teachers purchasing homes Partner with Monterey School District to help purchase homes and rent to teachers Habitat for Humanity – possible new projects Monterey Credit Union – second mortgages for teachers Emergency Loans to non-profits Capital loans for non-profits COPA – help in underserved communities.

The committee asked Dan to further investigate potential opportunities with Monterey School District and Monterey Credit Union regarding loans for teachers.

The committee agreed to meet in late March 2020.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned 5:25PM.

<u>Assets</u>

Total Assets through 12/31/2019 are \$291,832,217 an 17.37% increase since December 2018.

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2019.

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized losses were \$14,851, and unrealized gains were \$21,345,081, for a total gain of \$21,330,230.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$454,681 more than the budget, which includes 2% from the de Guigne bequest, and total expenses were \$109,693 less than the budget. Unrealized gains were \$59,431 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio. The actual net operating surplus is \$630,543 compared to a budgeted surplus of \$7,088.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 7.6 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000.

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 12/31/2019 was \$226,881,368. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 17.7% compared to the Policy Index of 18.3%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 12/31/2019 was \$7,639,444. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 14.2% compared to the Policy Index of 14.4%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 12/31/2019 was \$3,814,237. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 18.4% compared to the Policy Index of 19.8%.

The market value of the DRIM Fund portfolio at 12/31/2019 was \$2,537,937. The one-year Total Return for the DRIM Portfolio was 5.1% compared to the Policy Index of 4.0%. Due to the timing of the DRIM reports, there is a one-month lag in the performance reporting.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Pathways to Safety, funded by the ACTION Council of Monterey County; the Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation; the Monterey County Development Professionals, funded with the remaining assets from the dissolution of the Development Executive Network, to be used for professional development for people new to the fundraising field, and networking among those involved in fund development; and the Salinas Leadership project, funded by the James Irvine Foundation; and the Monterey County Gives annual campaign.

<u>Assets</u>

Total Assets through 1/31/2020 are \$290,124,854 a 12.73% increase since January 2019 and a .59% decrease since December 2019.

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2020.

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized gains were \$1,285, and unrealized losses were \$1,271,966, for a total loss of \$1,270,681.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$22,480 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$4,309 more than the budget. Unrealized gains were \$2,429 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio. The actual net operating deficit is \$255,074 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$275,647.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 5.5 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000.

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 1/31/2020 was \$225,212,482. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 10.2% compared to the Policy Index of 11.3%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 1/31/2020 was \$7,893,875. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 11.1% compared to the Policy Index of 11.2%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 1/31/2020 was \$3,840,343. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 13.7% compared to the Policy Index of 14.2%.

The market value of the DRIM Fund portfolio at 1/31/2020 was \$2,598,988. The one-year Total Return for the DRIM Portfolio was 14.8% compared to the Policy Index of 22.4%. Due to the timing of the DRIM reports, there is a one-month lag in the performance reporting.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Pathways to Safety, funded by the ACTION Council of Monterey County; the Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation; and the Salinas Leadership project, funded by the James Irvine Foundation; and the Monterey County Gives annual campaign.

Total Special Program revenue was \$2,667 and total expenses were \$48,335.







Proposed Fund Allocations for CFMC Grant Programs - 2020

The beginning balance of the Unrestricted (which includes the General Endowment) and Field of Interest (FOI) funds available for grantmaking is: **\$2,679,441**

- a) Available from FOI funds: \$2,024,090
- b) Available from Unrestricted funds (including \$389,985 from the General Endowment): \$655,351

After the following disbursements are allocated from the Unrestricted funds, **\$2,398,941** is available for the Community Impact (CI) grantmaking program.

- 1. \$280,500:
 - \$150,000 for the Opportunity Fund:
 - \$100,000 for Opportunity and Organizational Development grants to support small grants (typically less than \$5,000) for organizational development, emerging ventures and urgent needs.
 - \$50,000 for CEO Discretionary Grants for CFMC grants to support timesensitive needs
 - \$50,000 to the Neighborhood Grants Program (\$50,000 for grantmaking) for small grants to grassroots, mostly voluntary associations of neighborhood residents coming together around community improvement efforts.
 - \$50,000 to support Monterey Bay Economic Partnership's program expansion for affordable housing research and planning (third year of a three-year grant).
 - \$5,000 to support Leadership for Community Transformation, a collaborative community leadership training program for Monterey County (second year of a four-year grant). Note: the CFMC commitment is \$10,000/year: \$5,000 will be from CNE (Packard Foundation grant).
 - \$15,500 for various grants (MC Gives! awards and match: \$14,500; Philanthropy Day awards: \$1,000).
 - \$10,000 for CFMC Employee Matching Gift program (\$500 allocated for each of 20 employees).
