MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER - Birt Johnson, Jr.

Birt Johnson called the meeting of the Executive Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:32 on September 22, 2020.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion: to approve the July 22, 2020 minutes as written. Teri Belli / Betsy Buchalter Adler second. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR - Birt Johnson, Jr.

Birt recognized the stress in the community from the impact of the fires throughout the Central Coast. The loss of homes and poor air quality has seriously affected the state of California. Birt called attention to the CFMC staff and board for acting quickly to get grants out the door.

The past chair's luncheon was held via Zoom on September 2. There were 14 CFMC past chairs in attendance. Birt provided a welcome and Dan reviewed the highlights of the year, revisions to the strategic plan and response to the recent disasters. The 75th Anniversary PowerPoint shared the voices of many past chairs highlighting their memories of the work CFMC has done over the years.

The Executive Committee agreed to keep the November 24th meeting as planned.

TREASURERS REPORT- Jan Vanderbilt

Jan Vanderbilt reported the August financial statement will be approved at the October finance committee meeting. She highlighted the total assets through August 31, 2020 were \$301,558,829, a 13.2% increase since August 2019. The expendable operating cash-on-hand is at 5.2 months which includes the PPP. The actual net operating deficit is \$451,872 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$704,968.

PHILANTHROPIC SERVICES COMMITTEE - Michael Reid

Michael Reid acknowledged the CFMC organization for the pivot and nimble responses the team made during the pandemic and fires in 2020.

Christine Dawson reported the new position of Director of Philanthropy has been posted.

CFMC's Center for Non-Profit Excellence is collaborating with AFP, on a Zoom presentation titled *Demystifying Donor Advised Funds*, led by Christine Dawson and Dan Baldwin.

The launch of the 2020 Monterey County Gives Campaign will be September 25 for challenge gifts and November 12 for general donations.

The 75th Anniversary video stories and vignettes are active in different venues throughout local media and on our website.

COMMUNITY IMPACT COMMITTEE - Ida Lopez Chan

Ida Chan noted the CI staff has not missed a beat in making grants during the pandemic, working remotely and during the fire emergencies.

Covid-19 Relief Fund Grants Update

Laurel Lee-Alexander updated the board on the Covid-19 Relief Fund grantmaking. Approximately, \$3.2 million has been raised and over \$3 million has been grated for essential services, basic needs and the most vulnerable. The fund was temporarily closed to rebuild the balance. The CV-19 Relief Fund grantmaking was re-opened on September 18 and new applications are being reviewed.

Monterey County Fire Relief Fund (MCFR)

The MCFR has raised close to \$1 million and is working with affiliate funds in Carmel Valley and Big Sur to distribute grants to those most affected by the fires. CFMC team is being very proactive and working quickly by waiving the need for grant applications is some cases.

CI Grant Program

Laurel reported the CI team is gearing up for the Fall Community Impact grant season.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Giff Lehman

Giff reported a 2.7% positive return in the investment pool since the August board meeting. He will have a full update at the October board meeting.

COMMUNITY IMPACT INVESTING – Dan Baldwin for Nolan Kennedy

Dan reported the on the September 15 meeting. There was discussion about a possible vendor to handle some of the administration of impact investments. The committee is considering Community Capital Advisors, experts in this field with analytics reporting as their specialty.

The committee is looking at "where do we go from here?" Based on what they have learned in the last 18 months, Dan and Nolan are researching the areas of nonprofit loan funds, affordable housing and having discussions with community leaders.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE – Betsy Buchalter Adler

Betsy Buchalter Adler reported on the September 14 meeting which focused on the priorities outlined for nominating 2021 board members. Betsy presented a list of eight candidates qualified in the areas of estate planning attorney, philanthropic resources, the Seaside community, generational diversity

and emerging new leaders. Betsy will report at the October board meeting, after which the committee will begin reaching out to the candidates.

Betsy presented a proposed slate of officers that will be put in front of the board at the October meeting.

NEW FUND APPROVALS - Dan Baldwin

Dan described a couple of the new funds for August. The Pfeiffer Ridge Fund is set up to make a grant the Community Association of Big Sur (CABS) to purchase the home of artist Emile Norman in Big Sur. The funds will be used to retain the house and carry out the donor's intent for charitable activity in Big Sur.

The Weston Call Fund of Big Sur was formed as an affiliate fund, which was an awkward classification for the fund. The Call's and CFMC decided to reclassify the fund to a Special Purpose fund. This does not require a vote.

PRESIDENT/CEO REPORT - Dan Baldwin

Staffing report

Dan has been having one on one conversations with staff members to check in on their remote work and home experience during the pandemic. Michael Reid asked about whether there were any financial hardships reported by the staff from the Covid-19 shutdown. Dan discussed communicating openly to the staff about the foreseeable future and his confidence in the financial stability of CFMC at this point.

There are three open positions. The Director for the CNE is filled by Susie Polnaszek who has been named acting director. She is working closely with Laurel Lee- Alexander on the direction, goals and function of CNE going forward. The position will not be filled until a clearer direction for the CNE is determined.

The other two openings are Accounting Manager, and a Director of Development, a new position. CFMC is receiving and reviewing applications.

Legislative update

AB 2936 was not heard by the Senate Appropriations Committee so is no longer and active bill. Dan is working with a team of California community foundation CEO's to proactively write a values statement to describe how Donor Advised Funds (DAF'S) are utilized. The Community Foundation Public Awareness Initiative has been formed to educate the legislature staff on community foundation's donor advised funds process and positive results.

COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FOR MONTEREY COUNTY NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the Ten Months Ended October 31, 2020

Assets

Total Assets through 10/31/2020 are \$307,911,137 an 11.36% increase since October 2019 and a 5.51% increase since December 2019.

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2019. .

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized losses were \$5,515,658, and unrealized gains were \$2,904,556, for a total loss of \$2,611,102.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$209,449 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$159,708 less than the budget. Realized and unrealized gains were \$25,927 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio. The actual net operating surplus is \$78,841 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$450,571.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 8.2 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000, the building reserve of \$150,000, and including the PPP Loan of \$411,402, which is expected to be forgiven.

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 10/31/2020 was \$248,544,866. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 3.3% compared to the Policy Index of 3.7%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 10/31/2020 was \$7,731,675. The one-year Total Return for the Medium-Term Endowment Portfolio was 7.7% compared to the Policy Index of 5.7%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 10/31/2020 was \$4,047,720. The one-year Total Return for the ESG Portfolio was 4.2% compared to the Policy Index of 4.7%.

The market value of the DRIM Fund portfolio at 10/31/2020 was \$2,447,763. The one-year Total Return for the DRIM Portfolio was 8.3% compared to the Policy Index of -14.9%. Due to the timing of the DRIM reports, there is a one-month lag in the performance reporting.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Pathways to Safety, funded by the ACTION Council of Monterey County; the Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation; the Salinas Leadership project, funded by the James Irvine Foundation; the Census 2020 project funded by the State of California, through the Ventura County Community Foundation; and the Monterey County Gives annual campaign.
