CALL TO ORDER

Board Chair Teri Belli called the meeting of the Board of Directors of the Community Foundation for Monterey County to order at 3:30 PM, Tuesday, December 14, 2021.

CONSENT AGENDA – Teri Belli, Chair

Chair Belli welcomed the board. Stated that there was a very full agenda and that the first item of business was to approve the minutes from virtually every committee. She acknowledged the work done by these committees this year and thanked the chairs.

Motion: To approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Birt Johnson, Jr. / Fred Meurer. Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF THE CHAIR - Teri Belli

Chair Belli shared that the 2022 Schedule of meetings have been reviewed and are available on the board portal.

Chair Belli confirmed the Board Retreat date of January 22, 2022. However, she stated that an in person meeting would be subject to the COVID situation. She thanked the board for their responses to the evaluation and board topic requests. She and President Dan Baldwin will be pulling together discussion topics from those replies.

Chair Belli shared the note from Mel and Regina Mason, the Distinguished Trustee recipients.

Chair Belli recognized board members that would be leaving, Birt Johnson, Bill Sharpe, and Betsy Buchalter Adler. She applauded each of their involvement and commitment to the cause of the Community Foundation.

TEASURER / FINANCE COMMITTEE - Dan Baldwin

President Dan Baldwin presented the Treasurer/Finance Committee reports for absent Board member Jan Vanderbilt. He noted that with the early December meeting date the financials for November have not been completed. He presented the financial statements for October 31, 2021. He pointed out our robust numbers for grantmaking.

Motion: To accept the financials as presented. Loren Steck/ Elsa Mendoza Jimenez. second. Motion carried unanimously.

President Baldwin presented the 2022 Operating Budget Overview. He informed the board that the complete budget is on the Board Portal for the members to review. There was discussion regarding the staff compensation analysis and that, depending on the results, the budget may need adjusting during 2022.

Motion: To approve the Operating Budget for 2022 as presented. Birt Johnson, Jr./ Fred Meurer second. Motion carried unanimously.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - GIFF LEHMAN

Board member Giff Lehman reported the committee's November 5 discussion regard the 2022 Spending Policy. He noted last year's lowering of the payout from endowed funds from 4.5 to 4.25 was to increase the purchasing power in the long run. The Committee's recommendation is to stay at the 4.25 payout. Board member Lehman addressed questions from the board.

Motion: To establish a 4.25% payout for the year 2022 from our endowed funds. Giff Lehman/ Bill Sharpe second. Motion carried unanimously.

Board member Lehman shared with the board that it is a best practice to evaluate the Investment Consultant annually. Verus has been the consultant for nine years. The committee felt very strongly that the advisor has provided excellent service and the relationship manager is very responsive to our needs.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE – Birt Johnson, Jr.

Board member Birt Johnson, Jr. recognized the committee members and their diligent work in this process. He also recognized President Baldwin's effort in the process. He has three items to present to the board that have been reviewed and recommended to the Executive committee.

The first item is the recommendation to accept the four individuals that were contacted and accepted their candidacy to the board beginning January 1, 2022. CPA: Jesse Lopez, Managing Partner, Bianchi, Kasavan and Pope; Advocacy: Rene Menedez, City Manager Gonzales; Community: Larry Oda, former National President Japanese American Citizens League; Community: Lynelle Sanchez, City of Soledad.

Motion: To accept the four candidates to the board effective January 1, 2022 for a three year term.

Birt Johnson, Jr. / Kirk Gafill second. Motion carried unanimously.

Board member Johnson, Jr.'s second item to the board was the completion of board members Elsa Jimenez and Lehman's first term on the board. They both expressed their desire to continue with a second term as board members.

Motion: To approve a second 3 year term of board members Elsa Jimenez and Lehman. Birt Johnson, Jr. / Betsey Pearson second. Motion carried unanimously.

The third item is the officer's slate for 2022. Board member Johnson, Jr. informed the board of the proposed 2022 Officer Slate: Chair, Teri Belli; Kirk Gafill for Vice Chair, Treasurer, Jan Vanderbilt; and for Secretary Loren Steck.

Motion: To approve the nominees to the 2022 officer slate: Chair, Teri Belli; Vice Chair, Kirk Gafill; Treasurer, Jan Vanderbilt; and Secretary, Loren Steck.

Fred Meurer / Joe Pezzini second. Motion carried unanimously.

COMMUNITY IMPACT INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - NOLAN KENNEDY

Board member Nolan Kennedy recognized the committee board members and noted the two non-board members who are great assets to the committee. He presented the Impact Report and requested any questions or comment be directed to him. He noted that the current impact investments have been positive and performing well. The committee has been approached by the United Way with a proposal to help facilitate a purchase of a building. This is an exciting opportunity that the committee is investigating.

Board member Kennedy presented a proposed revised Policy Statement. To increase the committee's ability to do a single transaction from 50% target allocation to 75% target allocation.

President Baldwin shared a bit more information noting the ability to get into affordable housing with this revision.

Motion: To adopt the revised policy Statement.

Nolan Kennedy / Judy Guzman Krueger second. Motion carried unanimously.

PHILANTHROPIC SERVICES COMMITTEE - Betsey Pearson

Board member Pearson reported the activities of the philanthropic services team, noting the November activity. She gave kudos to the staff and committee. The committee and staff are looking at values based philanthropy. They are looking at revising the gift acceptance policy and will present to the board later. They also touched on crypto currency, events moving forward and engagement with the community.

Senior Vice President Dawson informed the Board of the Monterey County Gives campaign hitting just over 5.7 million as of this date.

COMMUNITY IMPACT COMMITTEE – Laurel Lee-Alexander

Vice President of Community Impact Laurel Lee-Alexander presented the list of grant approvals requiring ratification by the board.

Motion: To ratify 297 grants for a total of \$3,174,968 from October 01 – November 30, 2021. Loren Steck / Betsey Pearson second. Motion carried unanimously.

Chair Belli made comments to the board and staff for their participation in all these committees and praised their hard work, especially this month.

Call to Order

Board chair Teri Belli called the ZOOM meeting to order at 9:00 AM, on Saturday, January 22, 2022. Larry Oda, Rene Mendez, and Jesse Lopez were welcomed as new board members. The board and staff introduced themselves to the new members in an icebreaker.

2021 Year in Review

Dan Baldwin went through a PowerPoint presentation that recapped 2021 highlights, accomplishments, and framed 2022. The year-end review utilized the 4 pillars of our strategic plan: community impact, community leadership, philanthropic leadership, and organizational excellence.

CEO Goals

Dan reviewed organization goals for 2022. Board members thanked Dan for the overview and for sharing the roadmap of the organization's ambitions for the coming year.

Fund for Monterey County

Dan presented a PowerPoint presentation describing the Fund for Monterey County and its purpose. It is a discretionary grant pool for Monterey County that is divided into unrestricted funds, field of interest funds and designated funds.

Breakout Session Report – 2022 Priorities for CFMC

The board and staff separated into four small groups. Each group was asked to discuss Strategic Priorities for the CFMC. Four subjects were provided (but groups were not limited to them): Affordable Housing, Growing the Fund for Monterey County, Digital Divide, and Communication of values-based philanthropy. After the breakout, each group presented the results of their discussion.

Summary:

Equity lens over all priorities.

- Affordable housing:
 - Convene experts rather than provide programs. Spur advocacy and collective impact around issues. Tackle from an angle of influencing policy and using the COVID collaborative as an example of partnerships. Supporting middle-class work force.
- Growing the Fund for Monterey County
 - Keep as the highest priority. This allows us to address the greatest need in the community. CFMC has the perspective to prioritize and be flexible. Lead with impact to generate donor interest and trust. The fund can address the other issues we are discussing.

- Communication of values-based philanthropy:
 - Create stronger grant policy aligning foundation values with donor advised giving. Impact
 Monterey County mindset around appropriate organizations. Explore broadening CFMCs
 reach and create opportunities to engage the community. Ensure our intention is not
 perceived as political.

• Digital Divide

 The pandemic revealed the disparities in access to internet and other vital tech resources. MBEP has started a fund at CFMC to collect donation around this issue. Looking at other connectivity strategies that can be implemented.

• Other Priorities

 CFMC being a role as an advocate and leader on important issues, ie DEI, mental health, environmental issues. Foster community hubs/resource centers and play a role as convener across boundaries. Stress that we be cautious about becoming overly political.

Year in Review Video

Staff provided a video with a snapshot of the work of the CFMC over the last year.

Finance Committee Minutes December 14, 2021

The meeting of the Finance Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County was called to order by Dan Baldwin at 2:00 p.m. The meeting was conducted via Zoom.

Action Items

Minutes

Dan called for a motion to approve the October 26th and November 23rd meeting minutes.

Motion: Joe Pezzini made a motion to accept the meeting minutes, with a second from Birt Johnson, Jr. The motion passed unanimously.

Financial Statement Review

The October 2021 financial statements were reviewed.

Dan noted the \$30.5 million unrealized gain driven by the stock market performance. This has increased fund balances which will allow for more grant making next year. The twelve-month trailing return on the long-term portfolio through the end of October was 26.3%. The Special Program Revenue of \$5 Million will increase significantly during November and December because the Monterey County Gives program has changed to a special project fund from a donor advised fund. The Long-Term Fund portfolio is at \$310 Million at the end of October 2021, compared to \$248 Million a year ago. This growth is due to gifting and investment return.

Dan pointed out the Funds Held as Stewardship Funds Liability of \$49 Million. These funds are a liability because they are non-endowed agency funds. This category is more of a service to non-profits than an asset accumulation strategy. It gets the organization in front of many of these agencies Boards and helps to build strong relationships with their grantees.

Moving to the Statement of Activities, Contributions are lower through October 2021 due to a \$12 Million fund that was set up in 2020. This fund was the largest ever by a single agency. Bequests are lower than the prior year to date due to some very large gifts made in 2020. 2020 was a record-breaking Grant year with \$27.3 Million disbursed through December 31st. Through October we are already at \$31.3 Million. Dan expects that we could easily be in the \$35 to \$36 Million dollar range by the end of December. Looking at administrative fees we are \$115K in the black which is less than some years but always a good sign to be doing better than budget. Salaries and wages have caught up from earlier in the year due to the overlap of staffing due to several retirements and staffing additions in a very competitive market. Services are higher than

budget by \$41K due to the retainment of past employees to consult as trainers for new staff. Rent is under budget by \$18K due to a renegotiation with our Salinas office landlord.

Motion: Teri asked for a motion to accept the October Financials. Joe made the motion to approve the financial statements, with a second from Birt. The motion passed unanimously.

Discussion Items

Year in Review

Dan acknowledged that the work world has changed since 2020 and it is still a different time and work circumstance that we are living through. With respect to staffing changes, Kim Drabner was hired in early 2021 as the Director of Finance. On her first day of employment Diane Nonella announced her impending retirement. After several months with the organization Kim was selected to be the new V.P of Finance & Human Resources. Brian Erbele was hired to replace Kim after her promotion and Gianna Yim was hired as our Accountant. Dan acknowledged the Finance and Administrative teams working from the office every day since the start of the pandemic while others have been working remotely. During 2021 the organization has been working with Lee Kuntz on systems improvements to create more efficiencies within our processes. The Senior Management Team will be meeting tomorrow to discuss the status of this process as part of a strategic planning session. We once again had another clean Financial Audit which is in line with all of the clean audits we have had over the years. Dan also wanted to call out Monterey County Gives. This is the first Monterey County Gives for everyone in Finance except for Sarah Elias who transitioned over from an administrative position late in 2020. The program generates approximately five thousand transactions in a three-month period which creates a huge workload on the Finance team. Looking ahead to next year we will have to look at how much capacity opens up but we would like to look at a revision to our cash management policy and a possible banking relationship request for proposal. We are in the process of doing two compensation analysis's, one for staff and another for Dan so we may see mid-year adjusting going on based on what the analysis comes back with.

The regular meeting of the Investment Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County was called to order by Giff Lehman at 3:02 PM on February 14, 2022. The meeting was conducted via Zoom.

Minutes

On a motion by Loren Steck, with a second from Teri Belli, the November 8, 2021 minutes were approved as written.

Verus

Anne presented a review of the Work plan with a discussion of the topics to be discussed at the 2022 meetings. The topics and issues that may drive market activity in the coming year were presented as areas of focus for discussion.

YTD Performance

The market value of the Long-Term portfolio at 12/31/2021 was \$315,611,950. The YTD returns were 13.1% compared to the policy benchmark of 12.9%.

The market value of the Medium-Term portfolio at 12/31/2021 was \$9,788,112. The YTD returns were 4.4% compared to the policy benchmark of 4.9%.

The market value of the ESG portfolio at 12/31/2021 was \$5,746,382. The YTD returns were 10.8% compared to the policy benchmark of 10.8%.

It was noted that cash is being monitored. Anne will work with Kim Drabner to determine the need for and timing of rebalancing.

Active Manager Presentation

Anne presented data on the current active and passive exposures and performance ten turned the presentation over to Joe for a review of a Public Entity scorecard. The committee discussed methods for measuring active management performance and determination of value across sectors.

A review of ASB Realty was also provided. Changes in the real estate sectors was noted with a discussion of positioning within the sectors. Anne recommended that real estate be a topic for the next meeting.

DRIM Review

The performance was briefly reviewed. Anne noted the fiduciary duty to ensure the portfolio allocation is within the policy.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned by Giff Lehman at 4:38 PM.

The Community Impact Investment Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County was called to order by Nolan Kennedy at 2:03 PM. The meeting was conducted via Zoom.

Discussion Items

Nolan turned the meeting over to Katy Castagna, President/CEO of United Way of Monterey County for a presentation on the purchase of a building for a United Way impact center in Salinas. Katy introduced the Board chair of the United Way of Monterey County, Ms. Sandi Eason. Ms. Eason gave an overview of the factors that led to the decision to move forward with the project, as well as information on the purchase arrangement and intent for the building. The discussion was then turned over to Ms. Castagna for a presentation of the project details.

Ms. Eason and Ms. Castagna then addressed questions from the committee. With no further committee questions, Ms. Eason and Ms. Castagna left the meeting at 2:35 PM. Nolan then opened the floor to committee discussion.

The committee noted that a Phase I environmental study has not been performed. It was agreed that the Phase I study is needed. As commercial funds will also be sought, the Phase I study is expected to be a mandatory financing requirement. In addition, a termite inspection will be needed.

Action Item

Kirk Gafill made a motion to approve a loan to the United Way of Monterey County under the following terms:

- \$1.000.000
- 3.5% interest
- 5 year term with option to renew for an additional 5 years amortized over 25 years
- Interest only for first year
- Loan to be secured by any capital campaign conducted for purpose of building purchase
- Loan is pending positive underwriting

Assets

Total Assets through 11/30/2021 are \$368,588,661 an 11.27% increase since November 2020 and a 5.81% increase since December 2020. (p. 3)

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2020. A gift in the amount of \$172,414 was made to the Youth in Wilderness Fund on termination of the of the Cynthia Chaplin CGA. (p. 5)

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized gains were \$21,357, and unrealized gains were \$24,045,410, for a total gain of \$24,066,767. (p. 6)

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$347,272 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$210,027 less than the budget. Unrealized gains were \$10,520 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio and realized gains were \$10 on a stock gifts to the operating fund. The PPP loan forgiveness is reflected as Other Income contributing to an actual operating surplus of \$416,850 against a (\$563,059) budget deficit for a variance of \$978,909. (p. 7)

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 11.3 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000, the building reserve of \$150,000, and includes the PPP Loan, which was fully forgiven March 31, 2021.

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 11/30/2021 was \$305,211,828. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 13.8% compared to the Policy Index of 13.1%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 11/30/2021 was \$9,672,068. The one-year Total Return for the Medium-Term Endowment Portfolio was 5.6% compared to the Policy Index of 5.5%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 11/30/21 was \$5,689,991. The one-year Total Return for the ESG Portfolio was 11.0% compared to the Policy Index of 11.1%.

The market value of the DRIM Fund portfolio at 11/30/2021 was \$2,978,326. The one-year Total Return for the DRIM Portfolio was 33.3% compared to the Policy Index of 64.3%. Due to the timing of the DRIM reports, there is a one-month lag in the performance reporting.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation; the Salinas Leadership project, funded by the James Irvine Foundation; and the Monterey County Gives annual campaign.

Total Special Program revenue was \$7,157,680 and total expenses were \$8,462,227, which includes \$7,702,746 in grants from the 2020 Monterey County Gives campaign. **(p. 5-6)**

Comparisons of Actual to Budget - Operating Fund

Assets

Total Assets through 1/31/2021 are \$375,304,859 a 7.69% increase since January 2021 and a 2.94% decrease since December 2021. (p. 4)

Charitable Remainder Trusts (CRT) and Charitable Gift Annuities (CGA)

The CRT and CGA funds have been adjusted to reflect the activity and balances per Kaspick & Company and the third-party account balances as of December 31, 2021. (p. 4)

Realized and Unrealized Gains and Losses on Investments

Net year-to-date realized gains were \$1,026, and unrealized losses were \$11,844,544, for a total loss of \$11,843,518. (p. 7)

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$234 less than the budget, and total expenses were \$63,931 less than the budget. Unrealized losses were \$23,862 on the operating reserve held in the Medium-Term Fund portfolio. The actual net operating deficit is \$294,609 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$334,649.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 9.4 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$500,000 and the building reserve of \$150,000.

Portfolio Performance

The market value of the Long-Term Fund portfolio at 1/31/2022 was \$304,414,953. The one-year Total Return for the Long-Term Endowment Portfolio was 9.1% compared to the Policy Index of 8.9%.

The market value of the Medium-Term Fund portfolio at 1/31/2022 was \$9,879,463. The one-year Total Return for the Medium-Term Endowment Portfolio was 1.5% compared to the Policy Index of 2.3%.

The market value of the ESG Fund portfolio at 1/31/2022 was \$6,440,267. The one-year Total Return for the ESG Portfolio was 7.3% compared to the Policy Index of 7.0%.

The market value of the DRIM Fund portfolio at 1/31/2022 was \$2,966,211. The one-year Total Return for the DRIM Portfolio was 18.6% compared to the Policy Index of 28.3%. Due to the timing of the DRIM reports, there is a one-month lag in the performance reporting.

Special Program Funds

Special Program Funds include: Center for Nonprofit Excellence funded by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation; the College Futures Foundation program, funded by the College Futures Foundation; the Salinas Leadership project, funded by the James Irvine Foundation; and the Monterey County Gives annual campaign.

Total Special Program revenue was \$6,370 and total expenses were \$330,863. (p. 6-7)

Proposed Fund Allocations for CFMC Grant Programs - 2022

The beginning balance of the Unrestricted (which includes *The Fund for Monterey County*, formerly known as *the General Endowment*) and Field of Interest (FOI) funds available for grantmaking is: \$2,222,713.

- a) Total available from FOI funds: \$1,646,034
- b) Total available from Unrestricted funds (including \$324,547 from *The Fund for Monterey County*): \$576,679

After the following disbursements totaling \$214,222 are allocated from the Unrestricted funds, **\$2,008,491** is available for the Community Impact (CI) grantmaking program.

1. \$214,222:

- a) \$126,822 (plus carryover from 2021 = \$150,000 for grantmaking) for the Opportunity Fund:
 - \$100,000 for Opportunity and Organizational Development grants to support small grants (typically \$5,000 or less) for organizational development, emerging ventures and urgent needs.
 - \$50,000 for CEO Discretionary Grants for CFMC grants to support timesensitive needs.
- b) \$45,400 (plus carryover from 2021 = \$50,000 for grantmaking) for 2022 Neighborhood Grants Program (NGP) for small grants to grassroots, mostly voluntary associations of neighborhood residents coming together around community improvement efforts.
- c) \$15,500 for various grants (MC Gives! awards and match: \$14,500; Philanthropy Day awards: \$1,000).
- d) \$11,500 for CFMC Employee Matching Gift program (\$500 allocated for each of 23 employees).
- e) \$10,000 CFMC's annual Distinguished Trustee award grant.
- f) \$5,000 to support Radical Transformational Leadership for Social Impact, formerly known as Leadership for Community Transformation, a collaborative community leadership training program for Monterey County (fourth year of a four-year grant). Note: the CFMC commitment is \$10,000/year: \$5,000 will be from CNE (Packard Foundation grant).
