REPORT OF THE CHAIR – Gail Delorey

Gail Delorey reminded the board of the board retreat, Saturday, January 24 from 8:30 to1:30 at the CFMC's Monterey office. She asked the board to send any ideas or topic suggestions for the retreat to Dan Baldwin. Tonya Antle suggested a primer on the issues of homelessness and disaster preparedness listed in the 2015 goals.

Gail invited the current board members to attend the 2015 new board member orientation. The date has not been set at this time.

Gail reminded the current committee chairs to write up an instruction sheet for the incoming chairs to assist with a smooth transition into 2015 committee work.

Rick Kennifer presented Gail Delorey with a gift for her service as 2014 board chair. The board thanked Ann Brown and Kelly McMillin for their commitment to CFMC over the last six years. **TREASURER / FINANCE COMMITTEE-Tina Lopez**

October 31, 2014

Assets

Total Assets through 10/31/2014 are \$178,846,904 a 5.7% increase since October 2013 and a 2.46% increase since December 2013.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$123,337 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$5,281 more than the budget. The actual net operating deficit is \$109,933 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$227,989.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 6.0 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$250,000 and the building reserve of \$100,000.

Gifts, Pledges, Bequests, Future Funds Greater than \$25,000, and Grants

Total new contributions for the month were \$412,581, including \$50,000 from CASA Monterey County to establish the Voices for Children Stewardship Fund, \$50,000 from Mr. & Mrs. William and Nancy Doolittle for the Boys and Girls Club of the Monterey Peninsula Fund and the Farrell/Allen Carmel Rotary Fund, stock valued at \$106,890 from Mr. Fredrick W. Terman and Ms. Nan Borreson to establish the Fred Terman and Nan Borreson Fund, \$56,613 from the Estate of Mrs. Robert Stanton for the General Endowment Fund, and \$100,000 from Mr. & Mrs. Joel and Dena Gambord for the Joel and Dena Gambord Charitable Foundation Fund. Grants to agencies for the month totaling \$306,176 were approved and recorded. Interfund activity for the month totaled \$2,500.

Motion: to approve the October 31, 2014 Financials Ken Wright / Ida Chan second. Motion carried unanimously.

November 30, 2014 Financials Assets

Total Assets through 11/30/2014 are \$180,871,413 a 5.63% increase since November 2013 and a 3.62% increase since December 2013.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$192,632 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$17,191 more than the budget. The actual net operating deficit is \$218,287 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$390,100.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 5.4 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$250,000 and the building reserve of \$100,000.

Gifts, Pledges, Bequests, Future Funds Greater than \$25,000, and Grants

Total new contributions for the month were \$1,447,096, including stock valued at \$101,586 from Dr. George Somero and Ms. Amy Anderson for the Amy Anderson and George Somero Fund, stock valued at \$227,645 from Mr. F. Robert Nunes for the F. Robert Nunes Family Fund, \$340,000 from the Claire Giannini Fund for Girl's Health in Girl's Hands, \$80,000 from The

David & Lucile Packard Foundation for the MC Gives campaign match, \$60,000 from the S.T.A.R. Foundation for the S.T.A.R. Foundation of Monterey County Stewardship Fund, stock valued at \$26,831 from Mr. Robert Hartmann for the MC Gives campaign, stock valued at \$41,983 from Mr. and Mrs. William Reese for the Reese Family Fund, \$75,000 from Chamber Music Monterey Bay for the Chamber Music Monterey Bay Stewardship Fund, \$200,000 from the estate of Mary Dawson for The John & Mary Dawson Learning Fund, and \$189,900 combined gifts from individuals for the MC Gives campaign .

Grants to agencies for the month totaling \$517,168 were approved and recorded.

Interfund activity for the month totaled \$20,500.

Motion: to approve the November 30, 2014 Financials. Ken Wright \ John Phillips second. Motion carried unanimously.

Tina Lopez reported that the 2015 operating budget was approved at the Finance Committee meeting. Tina discussed the changes to the calculations for the estimated annual surplus and highlighted some of the projected expenses, such as, the website update and increased health insurance. The 2015 budget includes revenues of \$2,725,159 and expenses of \$2,648,830. Gail Delorey called for an executive session. At 4:00PM the staff returned to the meeting and a motion was made to approve the 2015 budget.

Motion: to approve the 2015 operating budget.

Ann Brown \ Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE - Ken Petersen

Ken Petersen reviewed the Pooled Endowment Portfolio Overview for the period ending 11/30/14. Ken described the current asset allocation and reported the CFMC is in compliance with the boundaries of the investment policy.

The Investment Committee reviewed Wurts & Associates, the CFMC's investment consultant, and feel the performance and services provided by Wurts have been beneficial and recommended maintaining the relationship with Wurts & Associates for another year.

Motion: to approve extending the relationship with Wurts & Associates as the CFMC's investment consulting firm for 2015. Steve McGowan \ Tina Lopez second. Motion carried unanimously.

The Investment Committee met on November 3 to review the 2015 spending policy. The committee thoroughly discussed the spending policy payout rate, including the annual portfolio return necessary to maintain "purchasing power." At the end of the discussion the committee approved recommending a 4.5% payout rate for 2015.

Motion: to approve reducing the 2015 spend policy payout rate from 4.75% to 4.5%, as recommended by the Investment Committee. Ann Brown \ Steve McGowan Motion carried unanimously.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE - Ann Brown

Ann Brown thanked all the committee chairs for completing the committee description updates.

Ann reported Jimmy Panetta and Erica Padilla Chavez accepted joining the 2015 board. There will be 18 board members in January 2015 with 21 seats possible. The Governance Committee will convene early in 2015 to consider adding additional board members.

Motion: to ratify the election of two new board members, Jimmy Panetta and Erica Padilla Chavez. Ann Brown \ Alfred Diaz-Infante second. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion: to approve the second term renewals for: Rick Kennifer, Catherine Kobrinsky Evans, Greg Chilton and Tina Starkey Lopez and the declined second term of: Jim Claypool. Ken Wright \ Ann Brown second. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion: to approve the 2015 board officers: Chair: Rick Kennifer, Vice-Chair: Greg Chilton, Secretary: Steve McGowan, Treasurer: Tina Starkey Lopez. Patti Hiramoto / Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

GRANTS AND PROGRAMS - Alfred Diaz-Infante

Alfred Diaz-Infante reported the Community Foundation awarded 94 grants totaling \$814,429 since the last board report.

Motion: to approve the 94 grants from October 1- November 30, 2014, totaling \$\$814,429. Alfred Diaz-Infante / Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

Grant Approvals

Alfred thanked the committee chairs, Catherine Kobrinsky Evans, Patti Hiramoto, John Phillips, Ann Brown and Meg Clovis for their commitment and recommendations for the Fall Community Impact grants. Each chair briefly described their experience from the three program areas: Patti Hiramoto thanked the members of the Strengthening Our Communities committee and found it a great learning experience. Catherine Kobrinsky Evans chaired Celebrating Our Cultures, and complimented CFMC staff member Aurelio Salazar, Jr for his energy and passion in keeping the committee organized. Catherine found the CFMC staff assessment of grants very helpful and time efficient. John Phillips chaired Stewarding Our Environment, and felt the new direction taken in the reviewing process worked well. He thanked Janet Shing for the excellent organization and preparation for the committee.

The donor advised co-investment added \$19,000 for the Fall cycle. Dan Baldwin approved 14 staff-reviewed small grants totaling \$113,500, enabling grant committees to focus their time on larger, more significant grant proposals.

Motion: to approve the Community Impact grant committees recommendations for 46 grants totaling \$933,125 for projects that address the Community Impact Fall-cycle grant priorities:

- 1. Arts, Culture & Heritage: \$403,000
- 2. Community Engagement & Healthy Places and Spaces: \$197,125
- 3. Economic Opportunity, Environment and Animal Welfare: \$333,000

Alfred Diaz-Infante / Catherine Kobrinsky Evans second. Motion carried unanimously.

Alfred thanked Julie Drezner for all her hard work over the last five years to improve the impact and process of grant making for CFMC. Julie's last day is December 19, 2014.

Julie Drezner described the Homeless Women's Fund grant recommendation for \$50,000 to Shelter Outreach Plus.

Motion: to approve Homeless Women's Fund grant recommendation of \$50,000 to Shelter Outreach Plus. Patti Hiramoto / John Phillips second. Motion carried unanimously.

NEW FUND APPROVALS – Dan Baldwin

Dan described the three new funds for approval:

- Benjamin Family Foundation is converting from an endowed fund to a non-endowed donor advised fund. They are changing the name, formerly The Benjamin Fund to The Benjamin Family Foundation.
- The Gloria Fund a non-endowed donor advised fund
- The Carmel Realty Foundation -a corporate donor advised fund

Motion: to approve the Benjamin Family Foundation, The Gloria Fund and The Carmel Realty Foundation. Catherine Kobrinsky Evans / Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT- Christine Dawson for Greg Chilton

Christine Dawson reported on the November Resource Development Summary, twenty-five new funds have been opened in 2014. The total contributions through 11/30 are \$9,842,026 compared to \$10,050,685 over the same period last year.

The Legacy Society lunch will be February 24, 2015 at the Monterey Plaza.

Christine reported on the Bubbles and Bags event November 15 that supported Girls' Health in Girls' Hands. The turnout at the Beach Club, in Pebble Beach, was over 250 people and the event will gross \$56,000. Christine sent kudos to Tonya Antle for her drive on Bubbles and Bags and the Women's Fund endowment. Tonya commented on the success of the GHGH Summit she attended, and the positive impression the girls made on her.

Brian Thayer showed the features of the recently completed Donor Central upgrade. The site gives the CFMC the advantage to communicate to donors that their funds can be easily accessed and money granted on-line.

PRESIDENTS REPORT - Dan Baldwin

Dan thanked Julie Drezner for the five years at the CFMC and acknowledged several major accomplishments: Julie had a hand in the development of the 2010 strategic plan, out of which came a Julie-led complete restructuring of the discretionary grants programs (now Community Impact grants), the Futer grants program, Girls' Health in Girls' Hands, the Women's Economic Security initiative, and much more. Dan and the board recognized that Julie leaves a strong legacy of work whose impact will be felt for years to come.

Dan reported the sale of Palm Terrace is pending with a solid offer, but still requires the approval of the Queen's Trust. Dan encouraged board members to login to the MCGIVES! website and experience how easy it is to donate to a wide variety of non-profit organizations.

California Volunteers (CV), in coordination with the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), has created a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to formalize the relationship between CV and community foundations. It establishes requirements for selected community foundations to be listed on the CV website as a potential destination for monetary donations in the aftermath of a disaster

This process will encourage the public to donate to organizations that grant to agencies providing direct services to the affected populations, thereby facilitating the dispersion of funds as quickly as possible.

Motion: to approve the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to formalize the relationship between California Volunteers and CFMC for a period of two years. Ann Brown / Ken Wright second. Motion carried unanimously.

Call to Order

Board chair Rick Kennifer called the special meeting to order at 8:45 AM, on Saturday, January 24, 2015, at 2354 Garden Road, Monterey. Erica Padilla-Chavez and Jimmy Panetta were welcomed as new board members. All the board and staff present introduced themselves and described their role at the CFMC.

Business Meeting

Rick Kennifer reminded the board of the 2015 committee assignments and announced the following committee chairs: Gail Delorey - Governance, Tina Starky Lopez - Finance, Ken Petersen - Investment, Alfred Diaz-Infante - Grants and Programs, Greg Chilton - Resource Development and Ken Wright, Audit.

The board received conflict of interest and confidentiality forms to complete and return.

Dan Baldwin reported that, pending approval, the proposed 2015 allocations from the unrestricted and field of interest funds are:

- \$150,000 from the General Endowment (GEN) to the Opportunity Fund -- the CFMC's grants program to support small grants (typically \$5,000 or less) for organizational development, emerging ventures and urgent needs. Nonprofits can apply for an Opportunity grant any time during the year and funding decisions are made by the CFMC's President, generally within eight weeks.
- \$ 50,000 from GEN to the Neighborhood Grants Program for small grants to grassroots, mostly voluntary associations of neighborhood residents coming together around community improvement efforts.
- \$10,000 from GEN for the Distinguished Trustee Award a designated grant to an organization to be chosen by the Community Foundation's 2015 distinguished trustee.

• \$400,000 from FUTER to be allocated for Community Impact grants that fit within the Futer Fund guidelines.

Total available for 2015 Community Impact grantmaking \$1,812,359

Motion: to approve the proposed 2015 allocations of \$1,812,359 from the Unrestricted and Field of Interest funds. Alfred Diaz-Infante / Greg Chilton second. Motion passed unanimously.

2014 Year in Review / Looking Forward

Dan Baldwin went through a PowerPoint presentation that recapped 2014 highlights and accomplishments. The report included work in each of the 3 major strategic plan areas: Community Impact, Philanthropic Leadership and Organizational Excellence.

Breakout discussions

At 10:30 the board went into three small groups to do a card exercise created by the Monitor Institute called, "What's Next for Community Philanthropy, Prioritizing Roles." The exercise is being utilized by community foundations around the country and is meant to help the CFMC staff and board think intentionally about how to build a strategic portfolio of activities.

The three groups were asked to consider four things:

- 1. To align the core, adjacent, and aspirational roles for our organization with our mission, capabilities, and resources.
- 2. To clarify which roles are out of bounds.
- 3. To think strategically about how the CFMC allocates resources across the core, adjacent and aspirational roles.
- 4. Begin thinking creatively about how the roles fit into a larger portfolio of prioritized activities for a future strategic plan.

The summarized results are attached to the minutes.

Investment Committee Minutes February 2, 2015

The meeting of the Investment Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County was called to order by Ken Petersen at 3:04PM on February 2, 2015.

Ken Petersen welcomed new committee member Jimmy Panetta.

Wurts & Associates

Anne Westreich reviewed the fourth quarter 2014 results. The market value of the portfolio at 12/31/2014 was \$144,398,309. The YTD returns were 4.0% compared to the policy benchmark of 5.1%.

Anne also reviewed the Active Management Environment report, the 2014 look back, and the 2015 work plan.

Anne reviewed the benchmark comparison report, and the committee discussed the benchmarks used. Bill Sharpe suggested, and Ken Petersen agreed, we should change the benchmark for alternative holdings from CPI+5% to something that is investable. Anne will research other benchmark options, and report her findings at the May meeting.

Stephen Dart commented a dichotomy exists between how we construct our endowment portfolio and our stated return objective.

Our Investment Policy Statement (IPS) governs our endowment and determines and monitors our asset allocation and manager selection. The IPS reflects modern portfolio theory and is mindful of the importance of diversification and risk management.

Our Stated Return Objective (SRO) is determined by summing our current spending policy (4.5%), anticipated inflation rate (2.4%) and approximate administrative costs (1.0%) that equal 7.9%.

The dichotomy occurs because the IPS and SRO are arrived at independently of one another. This needs to change in order to insure that our IPS and SRO are harmonized and the resulting allocation and objectives are consistent with one another.

There is only one (material) variable in either of the IPS or SRO over which we have any control: the current spending policy.

Given that our investment consultant projects that our anticipated 10 year growth forecast is < 7%, one of two things needs to happen. One, if we maintain an SRO of 4.5% then our asset allocation must be modified to target higher returns (which entails greater risk). Or two, if we are to be governed by our current IPS then our spending policy must be reduced accordingly.

The committee discussed Stephen's observations, and agreed further discussion will be included in the agenda for the February board meeting.

Discussion Items

Ken Petersen introduced the idea of adding a lower risk portfolio option, for the benefit of interested donors and agencies.

Dan Baldwin explained that many other community foundations have multiple investment options, and that he has received inquiries from local nonprofit agencies interested in this type of investment option, including one agency with approximately \$5 million to invest.

Dan further explained that this option would be available for new donor advised funds, new agency funds, and that we would not move funds from our current portfolio, unless requested by current donor advisors.

Dan will send the committee links to other community foundations with multiple investment portfolio options.

Anne will prepare scenarios for a low risk portfolio, and present them at the May meeting.

The low risk portfolio discussion will be included in the agenda for the February board meeting.

2015 Meetings

Ken Petersen informed the committee the meeting schedule will changed to the second Monday, of the second month, of each quarter, starting with the August 2015 meeting.

The remaining 2015 meetings are scheduled as follows:

Call to Order: The regular meeting of the Grants and Programs Committee of the Community Foundation for Monterey County (CFMC) was called to order at 9:00 AM by Alfred Diaz-Infante, Chair at the CFMC's Salinas office.

Motion to approve the October 2014 minutes: Patti Hiramoto/John Phillips second. Motion carried unanimously.

Grants and Programs Updates:

- 1. Laurel Lee-Alexander reviewed 2014 highlights and 2015 goals.
 - 2014 CFMC granted \$11.3 million (\$3.59 million in competitive grants)
 - 2015 Goals:
 - a) Advance Community Impact grantmaking toward strategic results
 - b) Boost Women's Fund Economic Security grantmaking and leadership
 - c) Expand role of CNE in supporting community leadership and nonprofit effectiveness
 - d) Continue expansion of activities in Salinas Valley/South County
 - e) Increase Grants and Programs alignment with CFMC philanthropic services to expand services to donor advisors, private foundations and corporations and scholarship programs
 - f) Assert CFMC leadership role in convening community around key issues
- 2. Janet Shing provided an update on the Community Impact (CI) Spring 2015 grantmaking cycle.
 - 95 applications have been received (69 CI and 26 small applications), requesting \$2.3 million, more than twice the amount available to award.
 - Applicant feedback regarding the new online grant system has been positive. An
 anonymous survey has been incorporated into the application to receive comments and
 suggestions regarding the new system. Training and fine-tuning are expected to be
 made throughout the year.
- 3. Janet Shing revised the Internal CI Grant Process and proposed a revised process:
 - Some grant applications for requested amounts of \$12,000 or less were submitted using the main grant application, rather than the shorter grant application for small grant requests.

- In an effort to streamline the process and use the committees' time most efficiently, the proposal for a revised process includes:
 - a) Staff will review the non-competitive applications as small grants, allowing the committees to focus on the larger, more impactful CI grant requests.
 - b) Committees will continue to review and rate proposals.
 - c) Instead of immediately denying the lowest rated applications, at staff's discretion, the less competitive proposals needing further research would be reviewed as a small grant application. (This recommendation is consistent with applications received under an inappropriate funding priority area; staff reassigns applications where they would be most competitive).

Motion to approve CI Grant Process Recommendation: Catherine Kobrinsky Evans/John Phillips second. Motion carried unanimously.

Prioritizing Roles for Community Philanthropy

The Committee discussed the Monitor Institute community philanthropy exercise conducted at the CFMC Board Retreat. The Staff and Board were in alignment regarding "aspirational" and "out of bounds" activities. Definitions were reviewed for "impact investing" and "growing local entrepreneurs and businesses." It was suggested that "*grantmaking* to grow local entrepreneurs and businesses be connected to impact investing."

GRANTS AND PROGRAMS REPORT

Laurel Lee-Alexander, Vice President of Grants and Programs February 24, 2015 Board Meeting

ACTION ITEMS:

1. Approve Grant Awards, December – February. Between December 1, 2014 and January 31, 2015 the Community Foundation awarded 217 grants totaling \$2,566,035 (See list of grants since the last board meeting.)

INFORMATION ITEMS:

1. 2014 Grantmaking Report:

At the Grants and Program Committee meeting on February 11, staff reported on 2014 grantmaking and reviewed goals for 2015. Highlights include:

- In 2014 CFMC made 935 grants totaling \$11,294,280 (24% increase from 2013's total of \$9.077,697 (all types)
- 32% (\$3.6 million) of grants were through CFMC's competitive grants programs (including Community Impact, Opportunity, Neighborhood Grants, Women's Fund, etc.)
- 109 Community Impact grants totaling \$2,145,025 were awarded from what is CFMC's largest competitive grants program
- Average grants increased 14% to \$19,629 from \$17,145 in 2013
- Women's Fund grants totaled \$370,0000 including \$1135,000 for Girls' Health and Girls' Hands and \$225,000 over three years for the Women's Economic Security initiative
- CFMC is currently in the second year of the Community Leadership Project (CLP) project which supports 14 small organizations serving low-income communities in Monterey, Santa Cruz and San Benito counties. The purpose is to help these small, grassroots organizations become more financially stable through operating support and intensive organizational development assistance. The CLP funders (Hewlett, Irvine and Packard Foundations) recently announced a one-year extension to provide "exit year" funding.
- Center for Nonprofit Excellence provided \$70,000 in small grants to 19 agencies. These Organizational Development (OD) grants strengthen agencies' internal operations through supporting strategic planning, technology enhancements, staff training, etc. In addition to OD grants, over 120 nonprofits participated in CNE-sponsored workshops and seminars, and LEAD's forth class graduated 14 emerging nonprofit leaders.

2. Community Impact Grants Program:

Community Impact (CI) applications are considered in the spring for the Investing in Our People program area. Spring review process notes include:

- Received 95 grant applications: 26 "small" applications (requesting \$12,000 or less), 52 for Youth Development & Education (formerly Building Blocks), 42 for Health & Human Service (formerly Wellness) and one ineligible (Arts); total requested: \$2,353,834.
- In the last couple of months, CFMC offered six Information Sessions in Monterey, Salinas, Castroville and King City. A total of 134 grantseekers were in attendance. The

purpose of these presentations is to help grant applicants understand what CFMC considers a strong grant proposal and provide an orientation about the new online grant application process.

• 2015 membership for the three Grant Committees: 25 total members.

3. Center for Nonprofit Excellence (CNE):

- Twenty mid- to upper-level nonprofit managers from Monterey, Santa Cruz and San Benito County are participating in the 2015 LEAD Institute, which began with a two-day seminar in early February.
- CNE is coordinating with the Monterey Bay Capacity Builders network on a series of training events related to evaluation. CNE will present multi-session seminars on organizational vision development, developing/refining evaluation systems, and using the resulting data for program improvement and fund development.
- The Futer Essential Social Services grant initiative will close mid-2015, after three years
 of capacity building support for 10 human services agencies. Grantees are working
 together to identify ways to share their successes and build greater
 community/fundraising support.
- Community Leadership Project (CLP) grantees are working closely with their mentors and will attend two local (Monterey Bay) peer learning meetings and other specialized training events.
- CNE will continue as a member of NAMC's coordinating body.

4. Neighborhood Grants Program (NGP):

- Chris Orman, Fire Chief of the North County Fire Protection District of Monterey was recently added to the Neighborhood Grants Program/Community Engagement and Healthy Places & Spaces grants committee.
- The deadline for 2015 Neighborhood Grant proposals is Friday, February 20, 2015 before 5:00 pm. A total of four Information Sessions were held in Seaside, Salinas, Greenfield and Aromas.
- We encourage board members to come to this year's culminating Neighborhood Grants Program Awards Ceremony, which will be held at Hartnell Community College (211 Central Avenue, Salinas, CA 93901) on Saturday, July 25, 2015 from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon.

5. Girls' Health in Girls' Hands (GHGH):

- Transition plans for GHGH continue to be defined in the Executive Hub structure, with
 members taking responsibilities for fund development and strategic planning for the
 collaborative. Committee members and their responsibilities have been defined. This
 process has encouraged a deeper participation and ownership of GHGH by its partner
 members. A timeline for transition process for staff, funding partnerships and reporting
 responsibilities and logistics will be set up this spring.
- The Girls' Leadership Network (GLN), consisting of 15 girls from all-member agencies, participated with educators from their agencies in an in-depth advocacy training led by the Youth Leadership Institute. As defined at the fall 2014 GHGH Summit by girls across the county, GLN are pushing for Social & Emotional health as the top priority for girl's health and asking the Board of Supervisors and the Board of Education to pass a Resolution to support the work of GHGH and to recognize the importance of this topic. The GLN will move forward with these resolutions and hope to gain the support of the

- Boards before the end of March. This process will represent our first step in policy making advocacy as a collaborative.
- The Year 3 (2014-2015) Mid-Year evaluation chart book which compiles data from the beginning of the year of girls participating in GHGH programs will be completed and shared with partners in late February 2015. This is a learning document that helps GHGH programs guide their work for the remainder of the program (school) year.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 6.5 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$250,000 and the building reserve of \$100,000.

Assets

Total Assets through 1/31/2015 are \$178,741,106 a 4.14% increase since January 2014, and a .32% decrease since December 2014.

Operating Fund

Total revenue was \$56 more than the budget, and total expenses were \$6,952 less than the budget. The actual net operating deficit is \$245,548 compared to a budgeted deficit of \$252,558.

Note: The Expendable Operating Cash-on-Hand is at 5.0 months, excluding the operating reserve of \$250,000 and the building reserve of \$125,000.






Pooled Endowment Portfolio Overview - Preliminary



Wurts Q4 2014 Report:

- Oil has captured the headlines with a 60% decline since June 2014. While the markets (CNBC) like to discuss these forecasts (trying to pick a bottom), the headlines seem to miss a larger issue

 is the price decline a technical issue due to excess supply of oil or is the decline due to more fundamental concerns?
- Historically, oil is shown to have a reasonably high correlation withglobal GDP, with the impact impact to each country varied. Global growthrates peaked in 2010 and have since been trending lower while oil prices remained higher...until now.
- 3. U.S. equities and oil prices have generally moved together over the past 10 years, but started to diverge in 2013. Will we see equities fall or will the Fed and earnings continue to be the drivers?
- 4. As oil prices have declined and the dollar has rallied, Q4 2014 earnings expectations have declined. The energy sector weight in the S&P 500 has ranged from 8% to 13% over the last decade.
- 5. The strong dollar is beginning to hurt earnings as 45% of the revenues of the S&P 500 companies come from overseas coupled with weakness in Europe, Asia and EM, which has been a drag on earnings.

CMFC seeks to evolve its grant making program to one that, while still broad enough to address Monterey County's most pressing needs, has greater focus, resulting in tangible and demonstrable impact. This program should be developed within an overarching framework that defines CFMC's programmatic purpose as "investing in healthy, safe and vibrant communities across Monterey County" -- a unifying theme that also encompasses CFMC's plan to intentionally exercise its community leadership role. Goal one will be driven by the following three statements.

- 1. Proactively be a partner and catalyst for addressing community challenges.
- 2. Focus grant making toward strategic results.
- 3. Strengthen nonprofit sector excellence.



Goal Two: Philanthropic Leadership Inspire and facilitate philanthropy throughout Monterey County.

The Community Foundation for Monterey County has a strong asset base, and an enviable percentage of endowed and/or discretionary assets. In its next chapter, the Foundation seeks to form new philanthropic partnerships and further increase those assets in order to continue supporting a grant making program that is fully responsive to the many needs in Monterey County. Not only should grant making continue countywide, but so should the discovery of new philanthropic partners. The Foundation also seeks more proactive engagement with its fund holders, to support their philanthropic goals, and to involve them more fully in the Foundation's work. The Foundation will exercise greater philanthropic leadership as a complement to its increased grant making focus and intentional community leadership. Goal two will be driven by the following three statements:

- 1. Grow CFMC's philanthropic assets.
- 2. Enhance fund holder philanthropy.
- 3. Seek and align with funding partners to realize greater community impacts.



Goal Three: Operational Excellence Optimize performance and stewardship for maximum impact.

At this juncture in CFMC's development, there is agreement that attention needs to be devoted to the Foundation's own internal capacity, even as it is recognized for its investments in the organizational effectiveness of the nonprofit sector throughout Monterey County. This need for some internal attention is validated -- at least with respect to governance and communications – by the views of external stakeholders.

- 1. Invest in infrastructure (human, financial and technological) improvements aligned with CFMC's goals.
- 2. Elevate CFMC visibility countywide; tell our story more effectively.
- 3. Build and maintain a strong, innovative, diverse board of directors and staff that reflect Monterey County.
